fourth Meteor touchdown. Montrose converted successfully when Jared Catlin ran into the end zone and the Meteors were ahead 30-24.

The Black Knights were in scoring range on their next drive, but Pitcavage was stopped short of the first down on fourth and five from the 11-yard line. The Meteors took over at their own eight and drove all the way downfield to another touchdown, their last of the game. The touchdown came in the fourth quarter, but Lehman stopped the conversion.

Lehman came right back to score on a long pass to Waslick from the 36-yard line. This time, the Knights opted for the extra point kick by Adamshick. The kick was good, and Lehman closed the gap to 36-31.

It then looked as if the Knights might pull off the win, as Smigielski led the defense. He stopped the Meteors for no gain at their own 45, then sacked Weller for the loss of nine yards, forcing fourth and 17 and a punt.

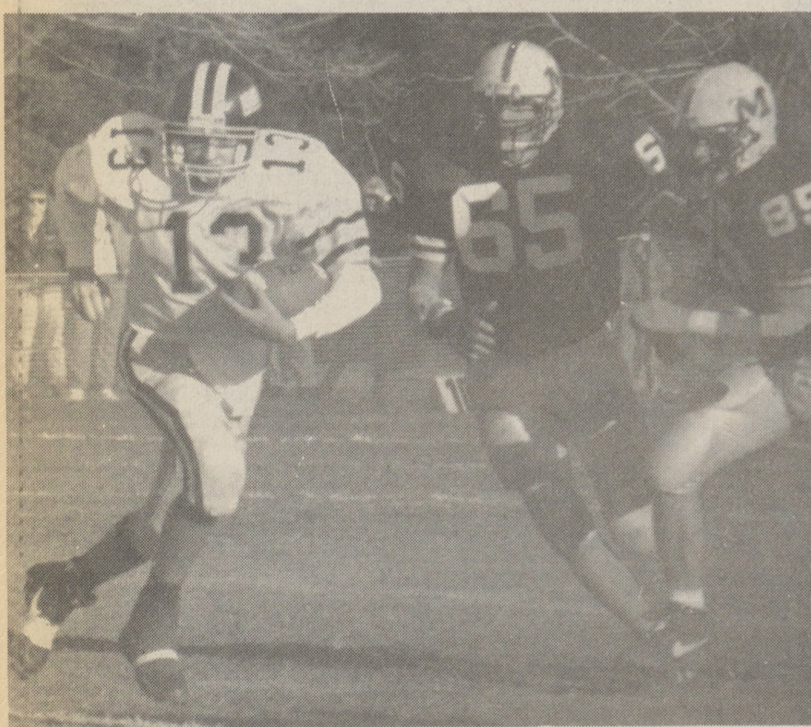
Lehman took possession with just over three minutes remaining. With Montrose putting on great pressure, Oliver threw three incomplete passes followed by his

only interception of the game, and the Meteors ran out the clock on running plays to preserve the victory.

"What killed us was the pass," said Lehman coach Gorgone. "We got them in a number of third and long situations and they ended up hitting the one foot touchdown there at the end of the third. About three or four times they came out long, and that's what we felt we had to do was get them in a long yardage situation and make them throw the ball, but whenever they did they hit the pass on us. As much as they ran the ball, the key passes they hit were what I think was really what hurt us. We just had to take those passes away in the third down situations and we didn't."

"Pit (Mike Pitcavage) had a nice game, John (Oliver), Waslick. They're all good kids. They're all tough kids and it was just an offensive day. We just wanted to make it 37-36."

Oliver ended the day 13-for-24 for 156 yards and three touchdowns, with the only miscue the fourth-quarter interception. The Meteors dominated the ground game, though, with 273 yards to Lehman's 177.

game for the Mountaineers. "That just shows you the kind of athlete Michael (Viglone) is...Michael just made a big-time play. He's a big-time player, and we don't get the ball to him as much as we should...Michael is an all-state receiver in anybody's book. We just don't run that style of offense this year.

The Mountaineer defense proved itself once more as it stopped the Grenadiers throughout the remainder of the game on key plays by Marty Straigis, Butcofski, Gingo and Steve Button. Dallas held the potent GAR offense under 200 total yard and recorded four sacks.

The game ended with the clock running down from the 11 second mark after carries by Rhodes and a Dallas first down at their own 20.

"It was a war," said coach Jackson after the game. "We both made some costly mistakes...It was like both of us were trying to give it away for a while."

"I think our defense got stronger as the game went on. They hurt us with some things early on that didn't work as well in the second half. I thought our kids adjusted well to a lot of things," said Jackson.

"I think the pride our kids take in defense is obvious. They bent a little in the first half and GAR did some nice things to them. But to hold GAR to six points...Our team this year is built on defense. We don't have the offensive weapons we had in the past years. We're a more conservative team...We take great pride in our defense, and I felt the defense in the second half was the difference in the game."

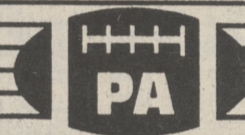
