

The police chief will receive a five percent raise, earning \$18,900, while patrolmen's salaries will increase \$1,000 or 2.3 percent to \$44,000.

Including \$16,000 carried over from work not finished in 1994, the township expects to spend \$30,000 on road repairs, while road equipment purchases are expected to come to \$27,500.

The supervisors plan to pass the final budget at their December 19 meeting.

In other business the supervisors:

• Authorized treasurer Alvin Cragle to advertise for bids for a used unmarked police cruiser with low mileage. · Appointed Sweet Valley resident John L. Young part-time patrolman, to work on an on-call, basis for \$7.50 per hour.

• Authorized resident Kathy O'Donnoghue to research the market for recyclables and costs of setting up a voluntary program similar to that operated by Lake Township.

"My family generates a lot of newsprint, aluminum and glass," she said. "Many of my friends have recycling programs in their towns and I think we should also."

"If we can provide this service to the township at no cost, we'll consider it," said David Sutton. "It's great that a resident has come forward to volunteer her time to help out."
