Students sign up for regular two-hour shifts in the emergency room, usually under the guidance of their designated emergency medical physician. The program is open to all Franklin & Marshall students.

Patel, a 1993 graduate of Wyoming Seminary, is the son of Vimal and Amita Patel, Shavertown.
