

Police investigate gunshots

Dallas Township police are investigating reports of several gunshots about 10 p.m. Monday night. Shots were heard along Lower Demunds Road from East Dallas to Fernbrook. An elderly woman called the Back Mountain Communication Center to report seeing a flash at the same time as the shots.

The shots were heard at the office of The Dallas Post. Paul Rismiller, the newspaper's production manager, said he thought they were from a small caliber rifle.

Shots also were reported along Lake Street in Dallas Borough. No damage was reported. A police report was not available in time for this issue.
