Mounts start cold against O'Reilly

13-point first half is too much to overcome

The Dallas Mountaineers couldn't overcome a disastrous

first half, and fell 78-44 to Bishop O'Reilly last Thursday.

Dallas scored only six points in the first quarter and seven in the second, putting them in the hole 37-13 at halftime. The second half was better, although O'Reilly still outscored the Mounts 39-31 on the way to an easy win.

Rick Klick led Dallas with 15 points, including one 3-point goal, the only one for the team. He was followed by Jeff Kunkle with eight and J.P. Cosgrove with seven.

The Mountaineers will play in the Wyoming Valley West tournament Thursday, and will host Lake-Lehman Tuesday, Jan. 3.

Taroli takes last Power Points week

Garry Taroli of Dallas won the Power Points football contest for the second time, in the game's last installment. Taroli's score of 90 points was highest among local entrants.

The statewide winner was Jerry Klima of North Huntingdon, with a 106 point score, the lowest winner in several weeks. The average of 26 local winners in the state was only 88 points, the lowest of the entire contest.

As a local weekly winner, Taroli will receive \$25 cash from The Dallas Post, and a free month of HBO from contest co-sponsor Tele-Media.

The Power Points contest handed out a total of \$12,750 in prize money during the 17-week contest term, more than ever before. Locally, The Post paid out \$425 in prize money.
