ATTY. JAMES BROWN

Atty. James Lenahan Brown, 84, of Trucksville, died Jan. 11, 1995, at Nesbitt Memorial Hospital, following an illness.

Born in Wilkes-Barre, he was the son of the late attorney Frank B. and Agnes Lenahan Brown. He studied at Wilkes-Barre Academy and was a 1928 graduate of Wyoming Seminary, Kingston.

He was awarded an associate's degree from Lafayette College, Easton, in 1932 and a law degree from Dickinson School of Law in 1935.

He served with the U.S. Army from 1942 to 1946, attaining the rank of captain, and was assigned to Judge Advocate General's Office.

He practiced law in Wilkes-Barre in 1935 in the office of the late attorney Charles B. Lenahan. He was later a partner in the law firm of Flood, Brown, Hourigan and Farrell, and the law firm of Flood, Brown, Farrell and Burns.

He was a member of the American Bar Association, Pennsylvania Bar Association and Wilkes-Barre Law and Library Association.

He practiced law for more than 50 years and during that time he served as solicitor for numerous boards, municipalities and organizations, including the Luzerne County Register of Wills. He also was a special assistant to the state Attorney General and served as the solicitor for the Luzerne County Democratic Party.

He was a member of St. Therese's Church, Shavertown.

He was a member of Elks Lodge 109, Wilkes-Barre and American Legion Home, Daddow-Isaacs Post 672, Dallas. He also was a Fourth Degree member of the Knights of Columbus and a member of the Bishop William J. Hafey Assembly, Council 302, Wilkes-Barre.

He was preceded in death by his wife, Irene Kearns Brown; sister, Mary Elizabeth; brother, George B.

Entombment will be in Mount Olivet Mausoleum, Carverton, Kingston Township.

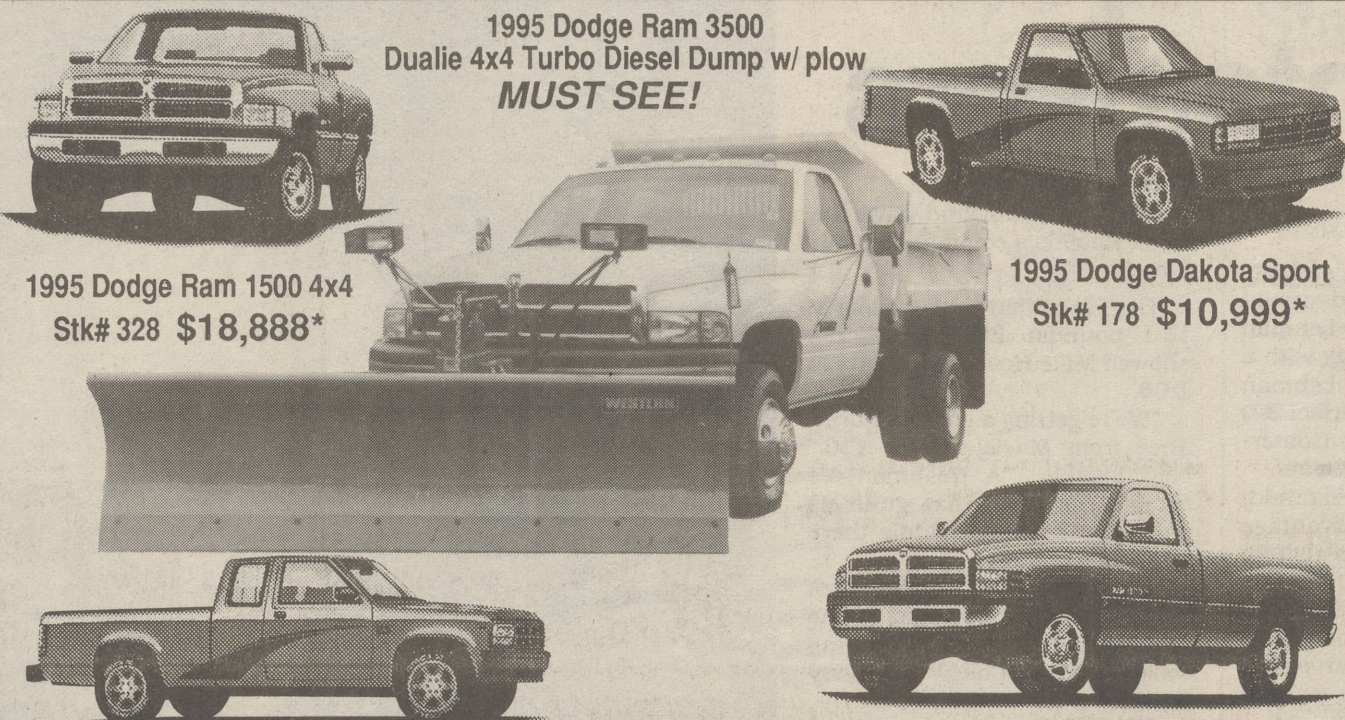

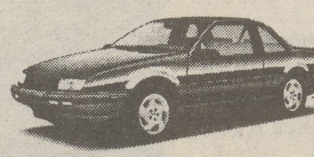

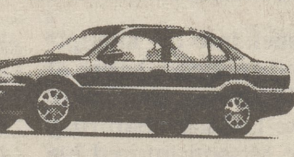
