Andrew Roblin & the Pocono Mtn. Men to play at Chicory House Feb. 3

Back in Canada, Andrew Roblin was a street musician who played "Duelling Banjos" while standing on his head. Now he heads a Pennsylvania bluegrass quartet that's attracting wide attention as it begins to move into the rop ranks of folk performers.

Andrew Roblin and the Pocono Mountain Men will bring their unique blend of styles to the Chicory House in Wilkes-Barre February 3 at 8 p.m.

The Pocono Mountain Men play fast-moving "hip bluegrass," spiced with the Native American/French-Canadian/Scottish music called Metis, from the wilds of Manitoba.

A native of Winnipeg, Roblin started playing banjo professionally at the age of 16, with the

Cowpokes, a "Grateful Dead/bluegrass band," where he developed the trick of playing the well-known banjo tune while two large members of the band held him upside-down by the ankles.

In addition to banjo, Roblin plays hammered dulcimer and contributes original songs to the Pocono Mountain Men.

Admission to the concert will be \$7 at the door. There are no advance sales or reserved seats; table and other seating will be on a first-come, first-served basis.

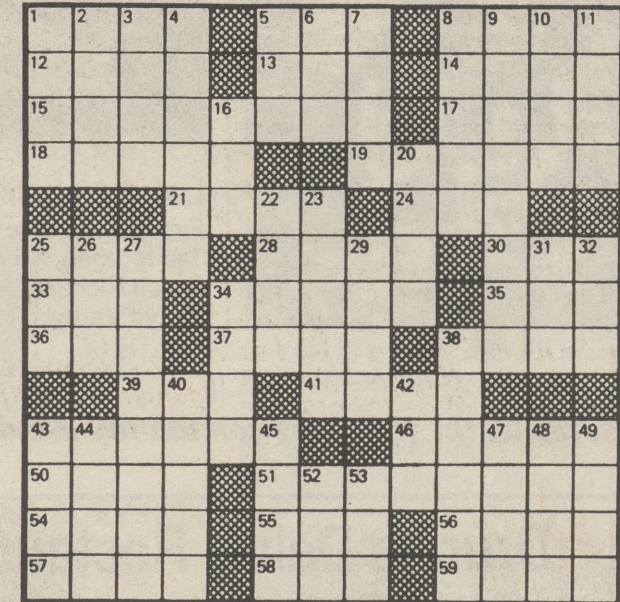
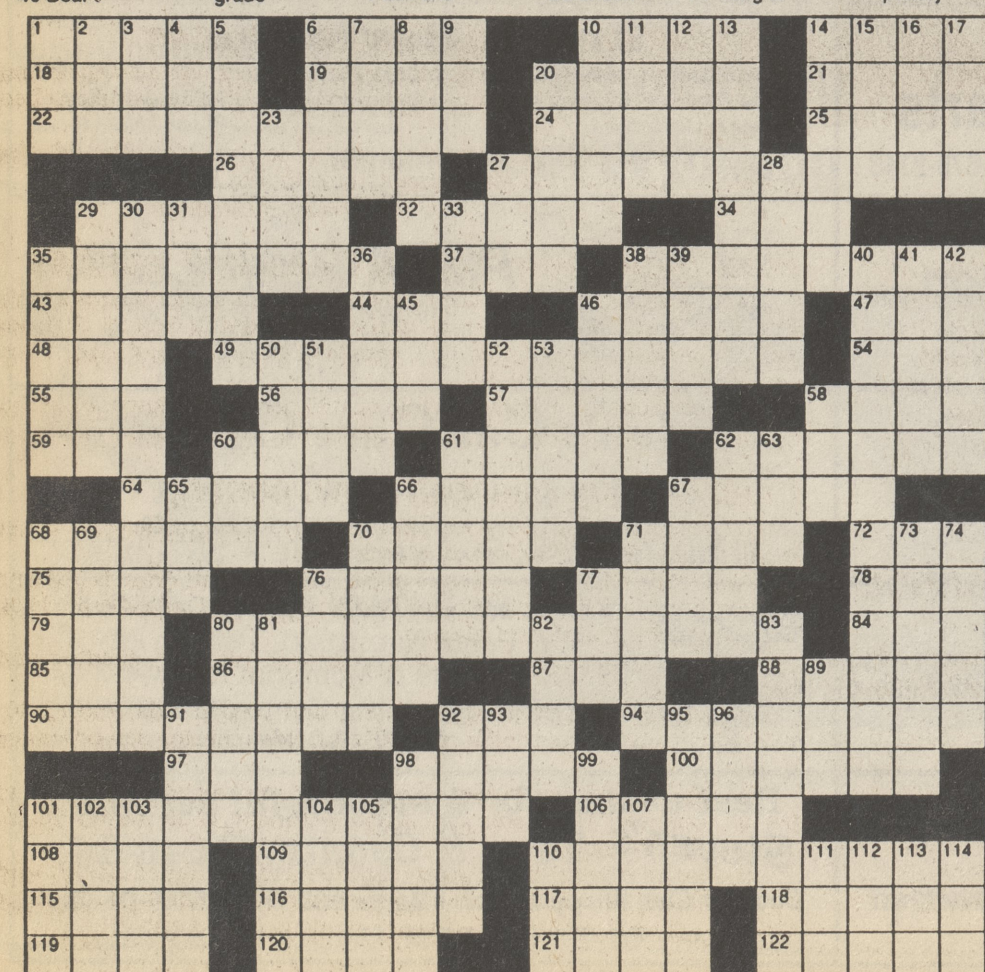

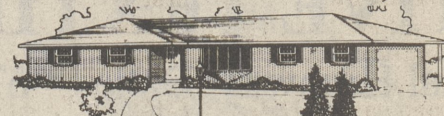
