Dallas sets dates for 1995 kindergarten registration

Kindergarten registration for the 1995-96 school year will be held in the Dallas Administrative Office Building, Church St., Dallas March 13-16, from 9 a.m. to 12 noon and 1 p.m. to 4 p.m. Monday through Thursday.

A birth certificate or other acceptable evidence of age must accompany each registration. A child must be five years of age on or before Sept. 30 to make him/ her eligible for Kindergarten.

Those with last names beginning A-E will register March 13; those with F-K, March 14; those with L-R on March 15; and those with S-Z, March 16.

Children who will enter first grade, but did not attend the Dallas kindergarten program this past term may also register on March 16.

In addition to the registration, vision, speech and hearing screenings will be given.

The school officials must review the child's immunizations to be certain the child meets the standards as set by the state regarding immunizations. Parents are to bring all records of their child's immunizations. If the student's records do not meet the standards, he/she will not be able to attend school.
