

DER still trying to evict lake beavers

Harveys Lake councilman Martin Noon reported at the regular February 21 meeting that the Department of Environmental Resources (DER) is continuing to study the problem of the beavers which set up housekeeping at the Outlet last summer.

"They're still working to get the joint permit to dredge the debris that's blocking part of the creek," he said.

DER is also trying to get permission from the owner of a smaller dam on Harveys Creek, about a mile downstream from the Outlet, to lower it by about 12 inches. Lowering the dam and the level of the creek would make the creek less inviting to the little critters, he said.

The council voted to accept the Elgeway subdivision, stipulating that the owners submit an off-street parking plan and move a set of metal stairs to the lake so that they conform to setbacks.

In other business, the council voted to:

- Accept a bid of \$400 for the purchase of the old police cruiser without its radio.
- Participate in the Back Mountain road materials cooperative.

Assigned to cover northwestern Luzerne County north and west of the Susquehanna River, Waterways Conservation Officer Jim Stout began his duties in the area February 21.

He'll supervise four deputy officers and work on public boating education, pollution investigations and investigations and enforcement on wetland and stream encroachment cases.

Stout is no stranger to the Back Mountain. He spent time here during field training and has worked on special projects in the area with both the Fish and Game commissions.

Stout was a deputy waterways conservation officer for nine years.

His training includes a 15-week municipal police officers' course at Indiana University, a 17-week course with the Fish and Boat Commission and firearms certifications.
