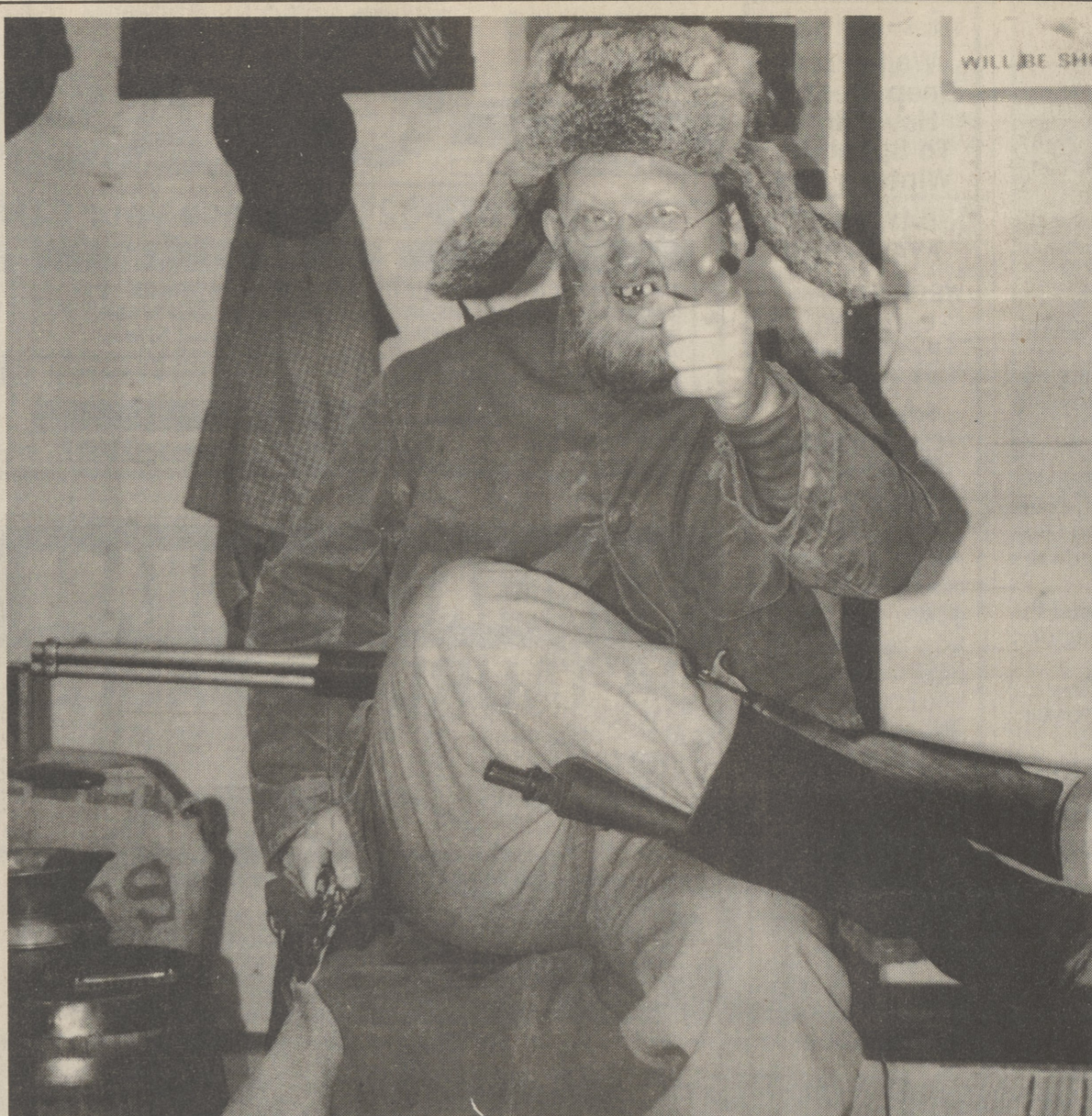

Unique living history program at L-L

Richard Pawling, 43, Sinking Spring, will deliver a unique presentation on the Game Commission's history from its creation in 1895, to the present March 15, at 7:30 p.m. at Lake-Lehman High School.

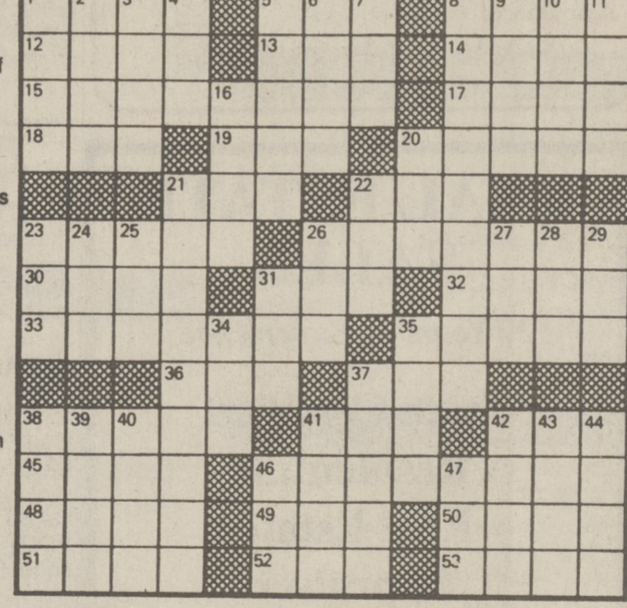
