The Nearly-New Kids Shop, operated by the United Methodist Women of Trucksville as a public service, will hold a clearance sale of all merchandise.

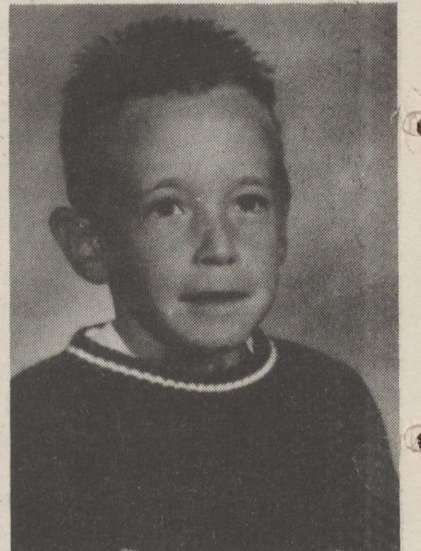
Because of the generosity of the church family and nursery school family, the Nearly-New Kids Shop is overstocked with good used clothing from infant to size 16.

The shop will be closed on April 15 for Easter and will reopen on April 22 with a new line of spring and summer clothing.

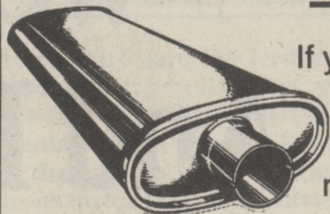
Proceeds go to the United Methodist Women's mission projects, including "Hope and Wholeness for Children and Youth" and local mission projects.
