technology, such as pagers and the new 911 system will make it obsolete."

The fire company has requested variances for side yard setbacks and parking requirements, which the Dallas Township zoning hearing board will consider at a public meeting April 10 at 7 p.m.

Zoning regulations require one parking space for every 100 square feet of building, Slocum said. The fire company doesn't need 68 spaces, since only five or six firefighters report to the fire hall when

they're called out. The rest report directly to the scene, he said.

Dallas Borough owns the fire company's present location, which the fire company uses rent-free.

Dallas Fire and Ambulance is funded entirely through its community fund drive and doesn't charge for its services, Slocum said.

"The entire community has given us tremendous support," he said. "And the sound management and long-term planning of the previous chiefs have helped make this next step a reality, so that we can continue to give the community the best possible emergency services."






