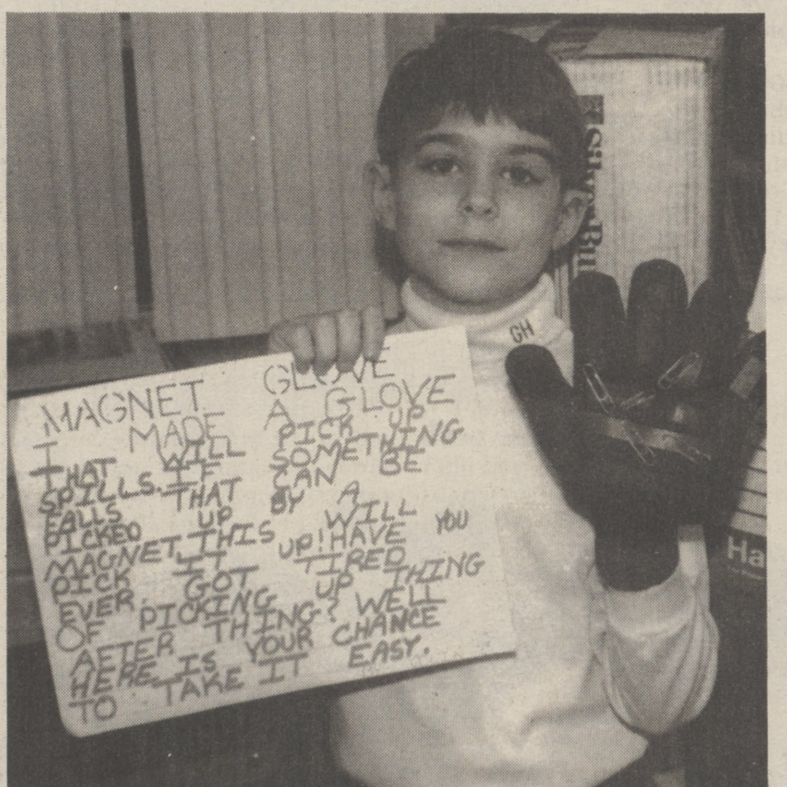
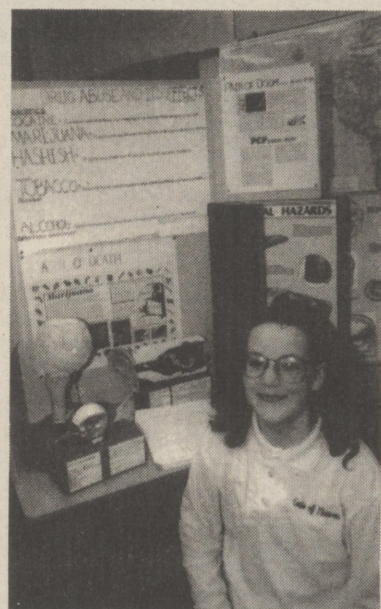
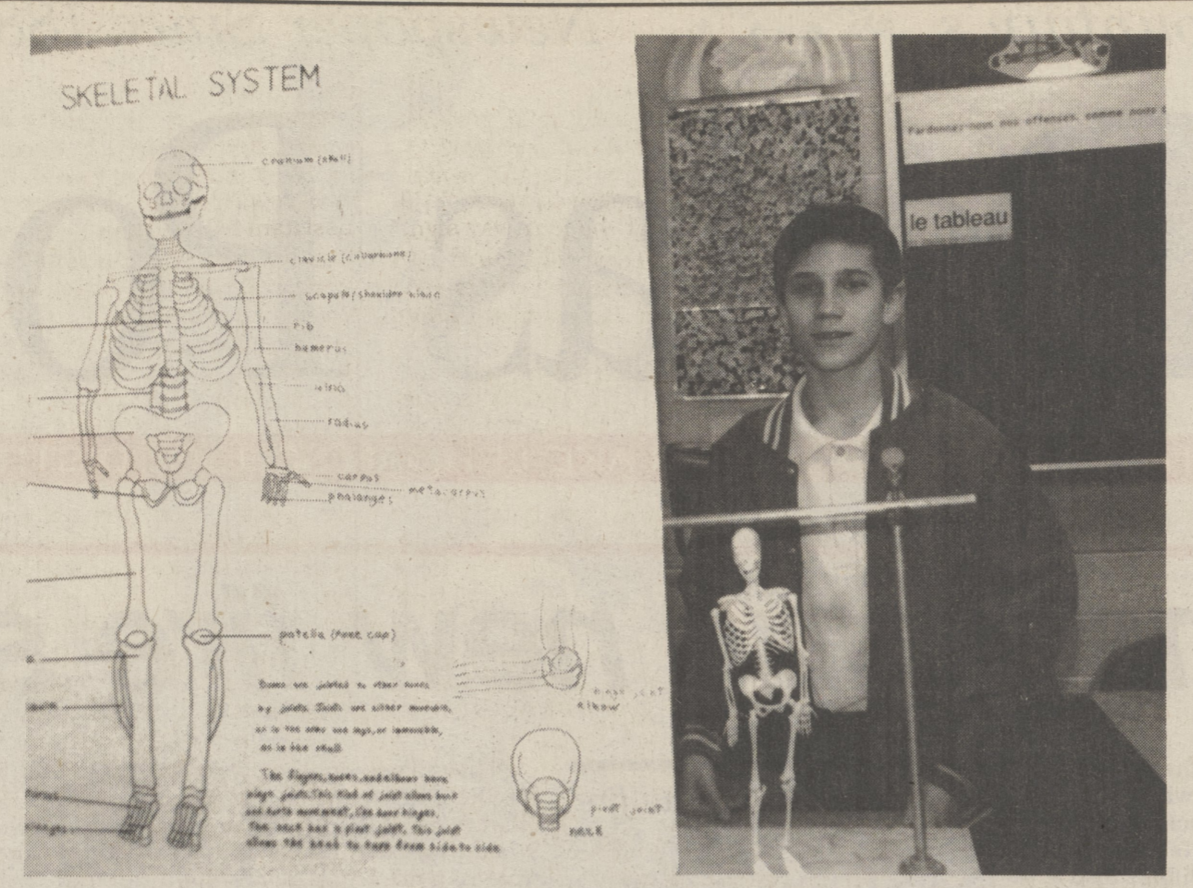
She was preceded in death by her husband, Lester B.

having a 50-foot right-of-way, according to secretary Sandy Race. Township regulations require local paved roads to be at least 20 feet wide, she added.

In other business the supervisors voted to:
• Award a \$475 bid for installing a concrete walkway at the municipal building, to comply with the standards of the federal Americans With Disabilities Act, to Mr. Ed's Construction.
• Award a \$9,999.99 bid to Russo Construction to replace the municipal building's roof. Work has already begun, Race said.
• Schedule the opening of sealed bids for the sale of the township's 1977 International dump truck and for the purchase of a new 13-ton dump truck with snow removal equipment.
• Schedule proposed summer paving projects on a section of Valley View Road damaged by winter weather and major widening and paving work on Lockville road, which the township will do itself instead of contracting it out.

They didn't appear on Luzerne County's road docket, an official listing of all county-owned roads, existing only on a repository list, a sort of official limbo.

The county "inherited" the roads, rutted dirt tracks barely 1-1/2 lanes wide, by default after a tax sale several years ago, not knowing that the "parcels of land at Crown Hill" were actually roads.

Homeowners desperate for a passable right-of-way have resorted to maintaining stretches of road in front of their properties themselves, using anything they could get their hands on to fill the worst gullies and either clearing

the roads with their own snowblowers or chipping in for a private snowplow contractor.

• Ask Luzerne County to replace a badly deteriorated one-lane bridge on Flat Rock Road near West Eighth Street. The county has estimated replacement costs at \$320,000, Race said.
