Each packet will sell for \$2.00. An information leaflet describing, as well as, instructions for planting and care of these seedlings will be included.

The Game Commission will also offer for sale wildlife food plot seed packets. This packet consists of a 10 pound mixture of assorted seeds, which are recommended for wildlife food. The mixture includes grain sorghum, prosomillet, buckwheat and sunflower. Each packet will plant one third to one half acre and will sell for \$3.00.

Bluebird nesting box kits will sell for \$4.00 each.


