Girl Scouts honor Marchetti, Hand

Dallas residents Sue Hand and Beverly Marchetti have been named by the Penn's Woods Girl Scout Council as Women of Distinction.

They will be honored at a luncheon April 30 at the Edgewood in the Pines Restaurant, Drums, which will also honor young women who have earned the Gold Award, the highest award for Girl Scouts during this past year.

Sue Hand, is being honored for her personal work as an artist and for her efforts as a volunteer in behalf of students. She established the Suzanne Maria Rossetti Memorial Juried Art Show, now in its 14th year, held at College Misericordia for students in grades 7-12 who attend school or study art in the Dallas, Lake-Lehman, Northwest and Tunkhannock School Districts.

Sue also originated the idea and coordinated the production of the *Back Mountain Color and Read Book*, sold to benefit the Back Mountain Memorial Library.

In an effort to raise funds for a local public Christian radio station, she created an annual scripture calendar seven years ago.

Sue is the founder and a signature member of the Pennsylvania En Plein Air Society, dedicated to painting on location in the out of doors, is open to all interested individuals of any level of artistic ability.

She has created and coordinated a School's End Contest, giving children in grades K through 6 an opportunity to earn recognition for their work.

Annually she donates a painting to be auctioned at the Back Mountain Memorial Library Auction in July.

Beverly Marchetti is being honored for her talents as an embroiderer, enriching the community with displays, teaching children and adults, beautifying libraries and churches and raising money for various charities and organizations.

She was a founding member of the Wyoming Valley Chapter of the Embroiderers' Guild of America, which now has 56 members.

Beverly has originated or participated in the displays at the Luzerne County Fair, the Fine Arts Fiesta, the Folk Festival and the Holiday Fair at the Luzerne County Courthouse.

She has set up shows at College Misericordia, the Denison House, the Wyoming Valley Historical and Geological Society, the Osterhout Library and the Back Mountain Library.

She has taught classes for adults and children at libraries, schools, and Girl Scout troops, and has donated embroidered objects to the Festival of Trees, the Osterhout Library, the First Presbyterian Church of Wilkes-Barre and SHARE.
