## L-L receives grant for counseling

Lake-Lehman School District has received a state grant to provide school-based mental health services, using Northeast Counseling to provide mental health professionals who will see referred children in private counseling sessions.

The goal of providing these services is both educational and preventive. Students will learn to develop greater coping skills, stronger personal behavioral controls or more successful social interactions with their peers. Offering assistance to these students who manifest mild difficulties will prevent more serious concerns.

Lake-Lehman will provide counseling only to those students whose parents wish them to receive it and sign permission forms. Parents may call school guidance staff should they have any questions about the program. There will be ample opportunity to communicate with the counselors once the program is begun. This service is an addition to the district's existing systems which

support students' mental health needs: the Student Assistance programs in the high school and middle level building and the Instructional Support Teams in the middle level building, Lehman-Jackson, Lake-Noxen and Ross Elementary Schools.

### Earns Wagner Scholarship

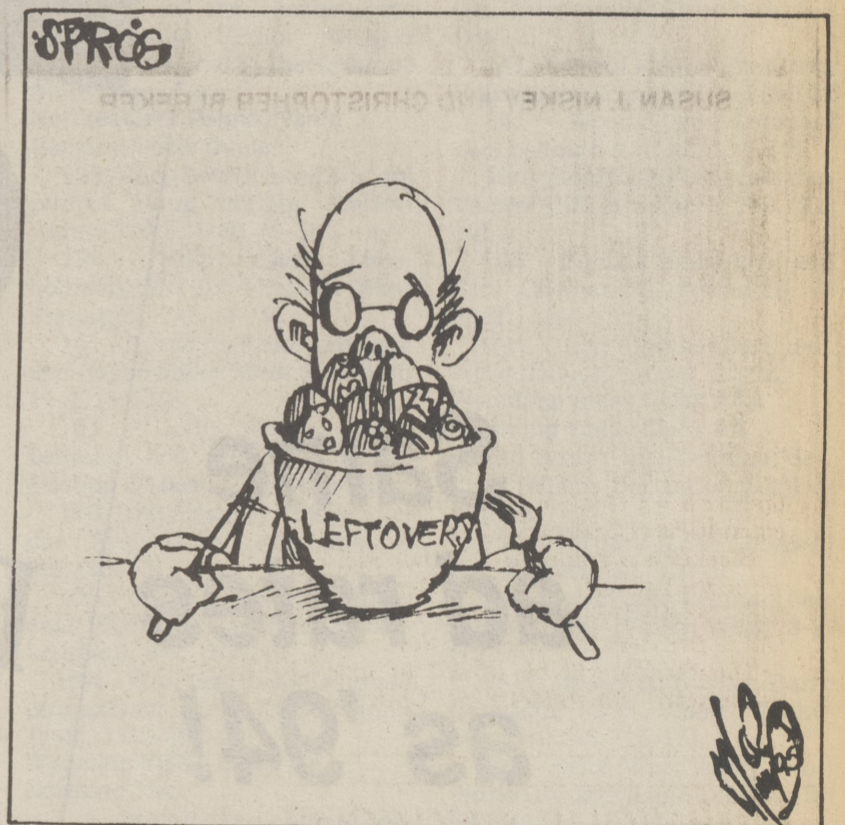
Jeffrey King of Dallas is the recipient of the Wagner Scholarship Fund at Susquehanna University this year. He is a senior biology major.
