Charismatic songwriting chanteuse Susan Werner, celebrating her first major label recording, returns to Wilkes-Barre's Chicory House, April 28 at 8 p.m.

Performing in an opening set for Susan Werner will be Joe Giacolo, a winner in the 1995 Chicory House Guitar Fingerpicking Contest.

The nonprofit, volunteer-operated Chicory House holds its coffeehouse concerts in the Community Room of St. Stephen's Episcopal Church, S. Franklin St., across from Boscov's, in downtown Wilkes-Barre. Doors will open at 7:30 p.m.

Raised on a working farm in Iowa, Werner came East to pursue a career in opera and

earned a master's in classical voice and music history at Temple University. While at Temple, the erswhile musical prodigy who had learned to play guitar by age 5, sax at 6 and piano by the age of 11, began playing piano and singing with jazz combos around Philadelphia and New York.

Admission to the concert will be \$7 at the door. There are no advanced sales or reserved seats; table and other seating will be on a first-come, first-served basis.

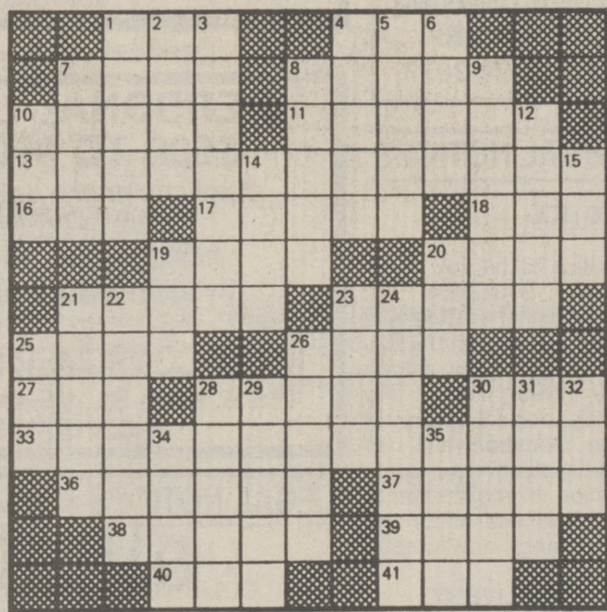
