Kasko seeks second term as Jackson Twp. supervisor

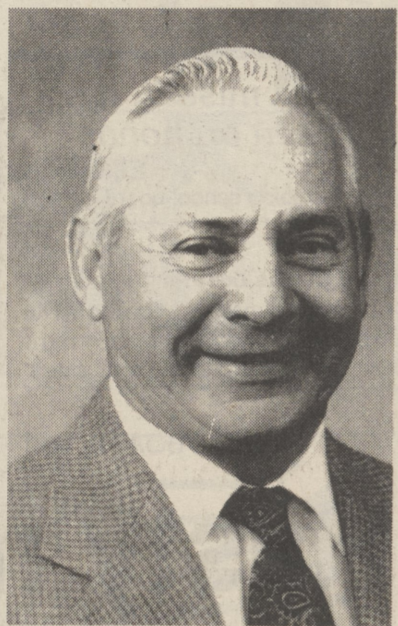

Local pilots try again in 3,000 mile air race

Back Mountain pilots Gerry Cooper and Charles Gordon will set out April 29 on a 3,000 mile roundtrip journey for the 11th Annual Great South Air Race Competition in Florida.

Both adventurers flew last year's air race for the first time. They will fly from the Wyoming Valley Airport at Forty Fort in their Cessna 172 for the long trip down the coast to Panama City, Florida for the start of the air race that will take them out over the Atlantic Ocean.

For six days, May 1-7, the tiny cabin of the airplane will seem like home to the pilots as they travel the almost 2,000 miles race route from Panama City to Freeport in the Bahamas.

They'll fly over Cross City, Inverness, Fort Pierce, Bimini, Governor's Harbour, Exuma International, San Salvador, Rock Sound, Marsh Harbour, Walker's

Cay and Freeport, passing through the Bermuda Triangle.

Cooper and Gordon are hoping to cash in on the more than \$20,000 in cash, awards and prizes awarded during ceremonies May 7 at Freeport.

Cooper is a corrections officer at the State Corrections Institute at Retreat in Hunlock Creek. He resides in Lake Silkworth.

Gordon operates Gordon Insurance at Dallas. He lives at Pikes Creek.

The air racers will receive a special festive salute at Wyoming Valley Airport (WBW) in Forty Fort April 23, at 1 p.m., sponsored by Wyoming Valley Airport Association, Inc. and is open to the public.
