MONDAY - Stuffed cabbage rolls w/tomato sauce, whipped potatoes, green beans, whole wheat bread, custard pie.

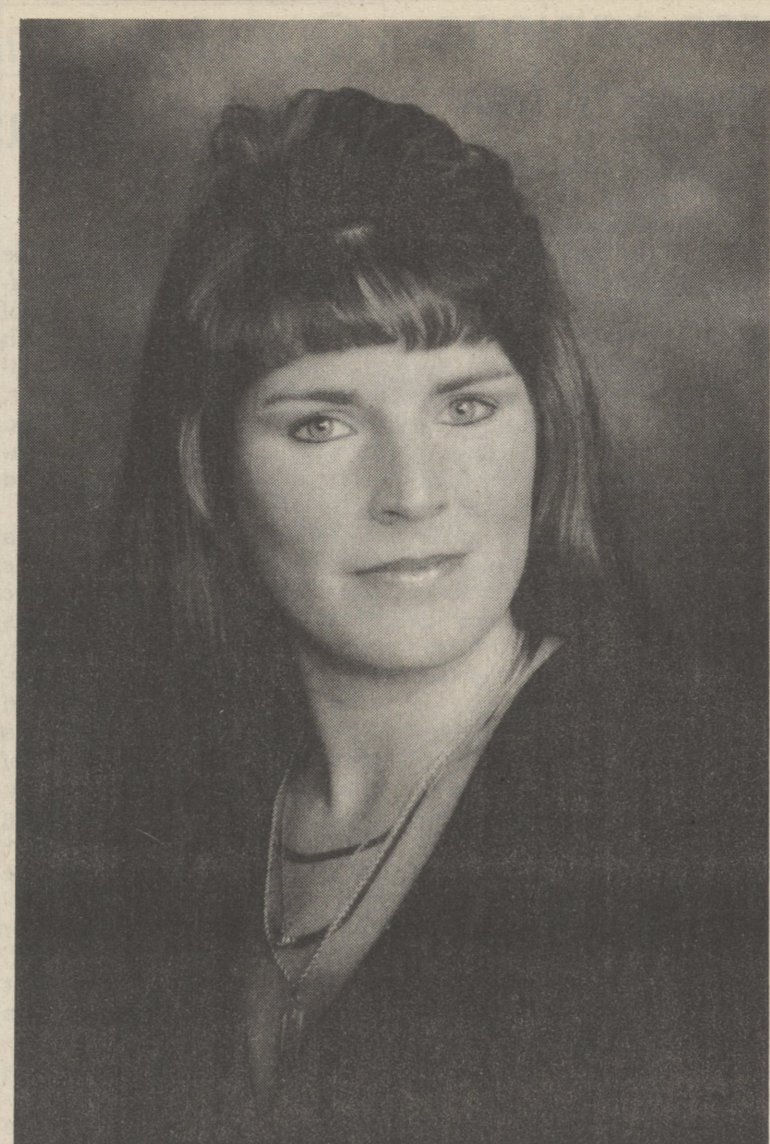
TUESDAY - Grilled chicken sandwich, lettuce/tomato slices, cole slaw, sandwich roll, cantaloupe slices, mayonnaise.
