

### Spring cleanup days in 3 towns

Dallas Borough, Kingston Township and Dallas Township will hold their annual Spring Cleanu May 8 through the 13th. Proof of residency is required.

The following items will not be accepted: Hazardous wastes, chemicals, brush, tree stumps, cinder blocks, animal or human waste, shingles, sheet rock, or other building materials, leaves, grass, garbage or newspapers.

Other information:

**Dallas Township:** Monday-Friday, 8 a.m.-6 p.m.; Saturday only, 8 a.m. to 3 p.m. at the rear of municipal building. \$5 service charge for large items such as: carpets, overstuffed chairs, couches, dressers, stoves, washers, dryers, T.V's, refrigerators, water heaters, tanks, freezers etc. Tires, \$2 each - only 2 per household.

There will also be a charge for pickup trucks, vans, tag-along trailers and larger vehicles.

**Dallas Borough:** weekdays 7 a.m.-7 p.m., Saturday, 7 a.m.-3 p.m. behind borough building. \$2 service charge per tire - limit two, must be removed from rim. \$5 service charge for mattresses, \$10 for large appliances, \$15 for more than one load per household.

**Kingston Township:** weekdays 8 a.m.-7 p.m., Saturday 8 a.m.-4 p.m. at East Center Street maintenance garage.

Coupons for full-size pickup trucks and larger vehicles available at municipal building.

### Subsidized meals for Girl Scout campers

## Supervisors award road, rec field bids

**JACKSON TOWNSHIP** - The supervisors awarded bids to American Asphalt to pave sections of Weavertown Road and to Evans Asphalt to pave sections of Longmeadow, Cross Creek, Blueberry and Stonington roads at their regular May 1 meeting.

Approximately \$39,000 in Liquid Fuels money is available for the work, according to chairman Walter Glogowski.

Although Sutton and Deerfield roads were also originally scheduled for paving, the township doesn't have enough money for them this year, Glogowski said. Sutton and Deerfield aren't in as bad shape as the other roads, he added.

The supervisors also voted to raise the rent for the apartment above the municipal garage from \$400 to \$425 per month, to purchase a flagpole for the front of the municipal building for \$1,113 and to award a \$43,614 bid to Bear Creek Nursery to excavate a combination softball/soccer practice field at the recreation park.

Raymond Smith and several residents living near the site of the proposed salt shed on Heritage Road questioned the supervisors about a site plan, treatment of runoff, a liner and provisions for treating contamination of nearby wells if salt leaches through the floor of the shed and seeps into the water table.

"Must you file an environmental impact statement for this?" Smith asked.

"We have stored road salt there for more than 25 years," Glogowski replied. "We're not increasing the amount, just placing it under cover. We don't anticipate creating more runoff than is there already."

He added that the salt shed would be made of precast concrete blocks, which would be sealed against leakage.

Further studies and a site plan haven't been done yet, he said.

The water company has given the township several truckloads of dirt, which will be levelled, graded and seeded to prepare the site.

The supervisors plan to award a bid to build the salt shed in July.

A 1957 graduate of Laketon High School, he was employed as a township truck driver.

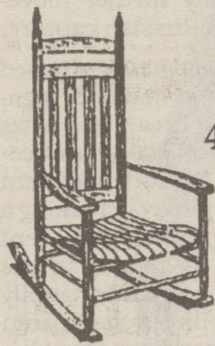
He was a past Cub Scout Master for the Oneonta Council in New York.
