
Normally only one man works each of the two night shifts, he

The white cruiser was inspected Monday, but the four-wheel-drive cruiser needs some repairs before it will pass inspection, Boice said.

"Even if a cruiser wasn't available, the borough's insurance would have covered the personal car of the officer on duty if he'd had to use it," he added.

Chief Bulford is responsible for making sure all police vehicles are inspected, Boice said.

He wasn't sure if a police officer driving a cruiser with an expired inspection sticker would be able to write himself a ticket or if he'd have to get a state trooper to do it
