

Outdated inspections ground Harveys Lake's cruisers

HARVEYS LAKE - The police officer on the graveyard shift received an unwelcome surprise when he came on duty Sunday night.

He was grounded. The inspection stickers on two of the borough's three cruisers expired at midnight and the third car was at a nearby garage having some lettering finished.

"It didn't create any problems," said mayor Rick Boice Monday afternoon. "Officer Karlonis, who was on duty for that shift, and Chief Bulford went up to the garage at 11 p.m. and brought the gray cruiser back to the police station. The night officer told me

about it."

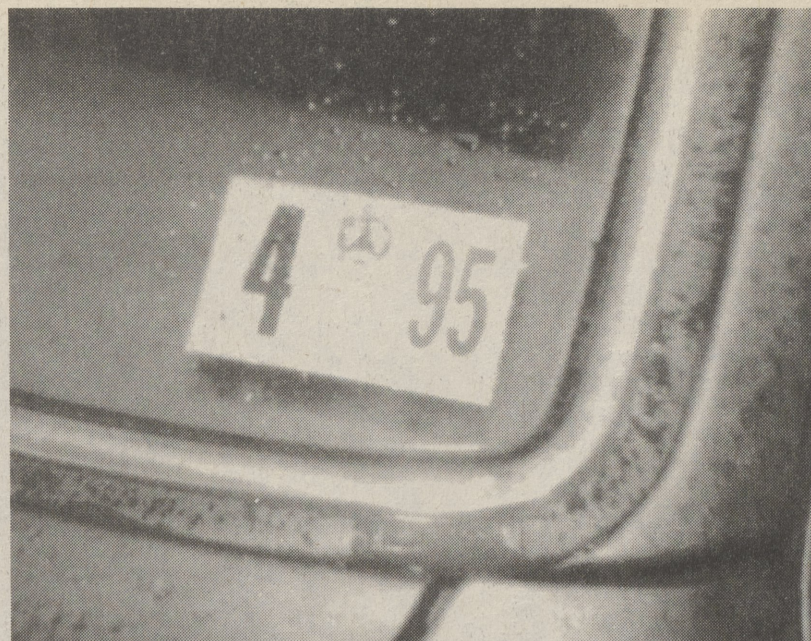
Normally only one man works each of the two night shifts, he added.

The white cruiser was inspected Monday, but the four-wheel-drive cruiser needs some repairs before it will pass inspection, Boice said.

"Even if a cruiser wasn't available, the borough's insurance would have covered the personal car of the officer on duty if he'd had to use it," he added.

Chief Bulford is responsible for making sure all police vehicles are inspected, Boice said.

He wasn't sure if a police officer driving a cruiser with an expired inspection sticker would be able to write himself a ticket or if he'd have to get a state trooper to do it for him.

St. Paul's Lutheran will celebrate 70th anniversary

On Sunday, May 7, 1995, St. Paul's Lutheran Church in Shavertown will celebrate 70 years of ministry to the congregation and the Back Mountain community. The congregation was formally organized May 10, 1925, when the charter members met for the first church service in the old Shavertown School building. The first service in the church building on Main and Franklin Streets was held on May 14, 1926.

Besides the usual church organizations which utilize the building, St. Paul's facilities have been made available to various Back Mountain groups. At the present time, the congregation is considering future building needs which will more effectively serve the growing congregation and community.

Holy Communion will be celebrated at the 10:00 a.m. service on Sunday, May 7, and the congregation will remember the past by using portions of the liturgy used when the church was founded.

Also, special music and anthems are planned, along with a history reading of the congregation by the Senior High Sunday School Class. Following the service, a reception will be held in the church's social room.

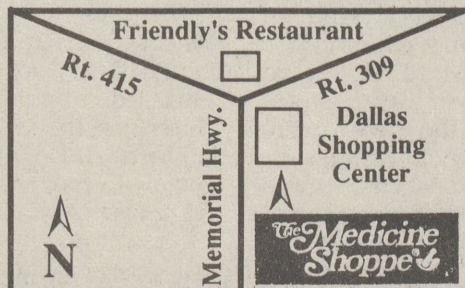
