WEDNESDAY - Stuffed shells

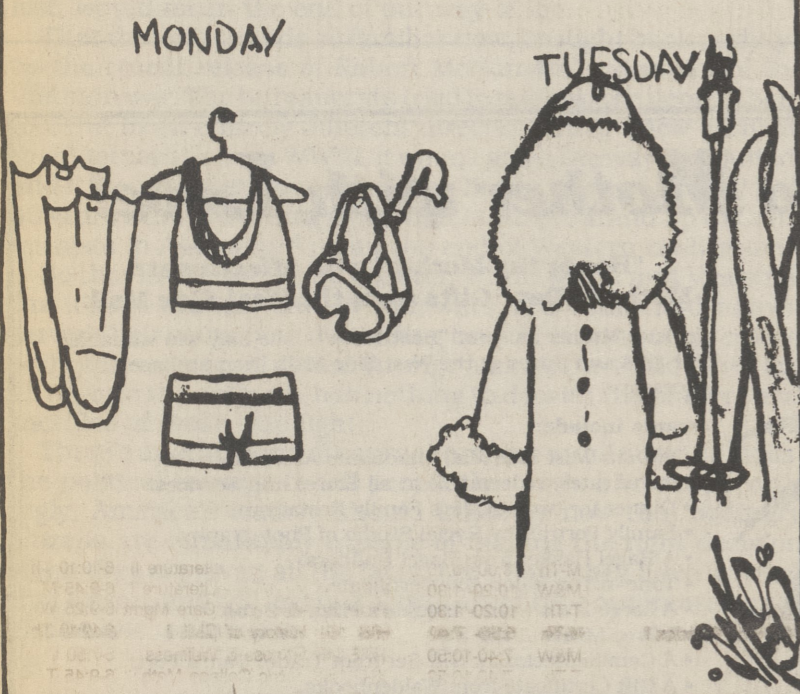

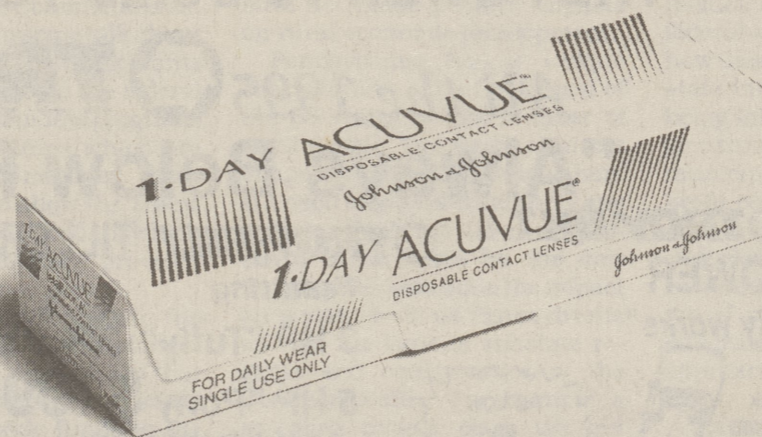
Legion Ladies to hold flea mart May 7
