

Trucksville resident Andrea Taroli, MD, has founded Bravo! Dance, an ensemble of dancers who have joined together to perform the original choreography artistic directors, Trinette Singleton and Nana Badrena.

Singleton is revered for her extensive career as principal dancer with the Joffrey Ballet. She has been featured on the covers of Time, Life and Dance Magazines, and is well known for her pioneering role in the multimedia rock ballet "Astarte".

Badrena's choreography has been widely acclaimed in the United States and her native Puerto Rico. In Cuba, she garnered a national award for her choreographic collaboration with Alicia Alonzo.

The people of Bravo! Dance joined together with executive director Andrea Taroli, MD, to form the company, which is beginning its fundraising efforts in preparation for its debut benefit performance in Wilkes-Barre in the fall of 1995.
