## Orienteering meet May 21 at Frances Slocum Park

The Pocono Orienteering Club (POC) will hold an event May 21 at Frances Slocum State Park in Trucksville.

In orienteering, participants use a detailed-five color topographical map and compass to navigate a marked course in the field. Appropriate footwear is suggested. No prior experience is needed.

Participants can register and start any time between 10 a.m. and noon at the park's Nature Center. Entry fee is \$5 for nonmembers and instruction is always available. Compasses can be rented for fifty cents.

Designed as an introduction to orienteering, the event will feature nine short courses, divided into beginner, intermediate and advanced difficulty. For one entry fee, participants can try as many different courses as they wish.

Each course brings the participant back to the start/finish area, where they can discuss their performance and begin a different course. Beginners' courses will use only well-marked hiking trails and are appropriate for families, who can use one map.

Microfilm holdings include Census Records 1790-1920, military service records of the Revolutionary War, (1775-1783), War of 1812 (1812-1815), Mexican War (1846-1848), Civil War, naturalization petitions and passenger

history from the First Continental arrival lists for the ports of Baltimore, Maryland, Galveston, Texas, Philadelphia and St. Albans, Vermont.




