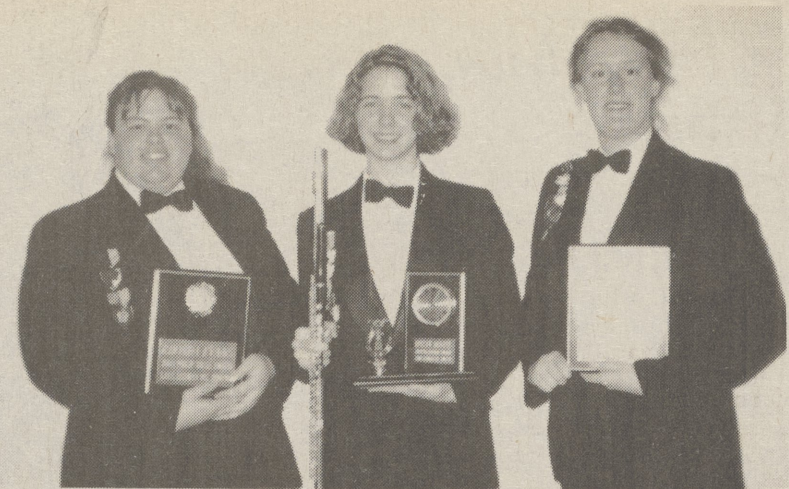

Sherry plans to attend Wilkes University on a Presidential Scholarship for Academics with a major in pharmacy and hopes to work in a research clinic studying cancer.

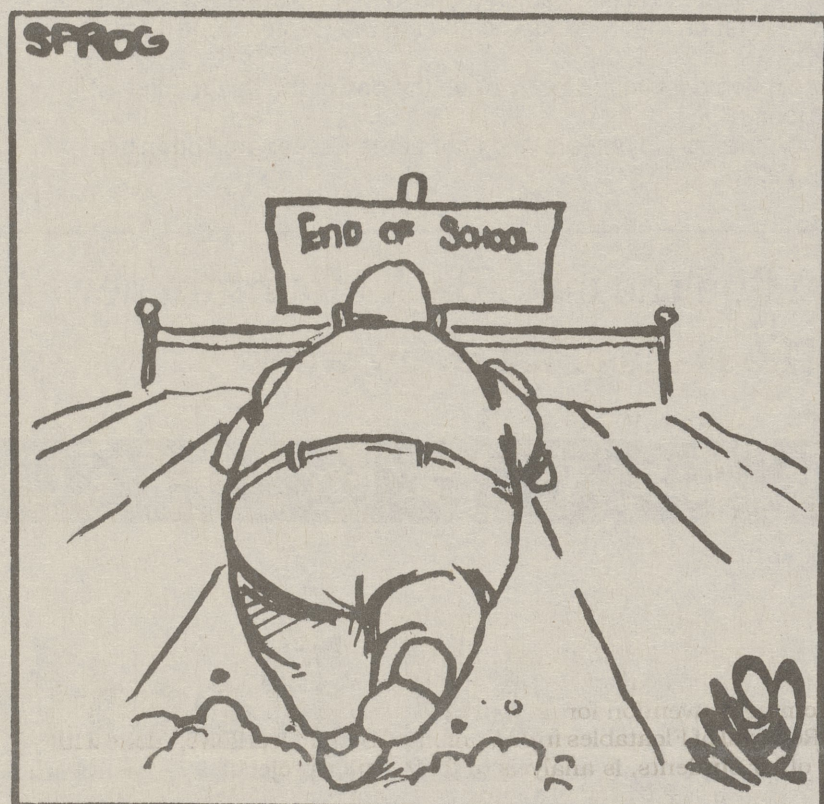
Dallas to hold driver theory class

Dallas High School will hold a driver theory class for all public and private school students who live in the district.

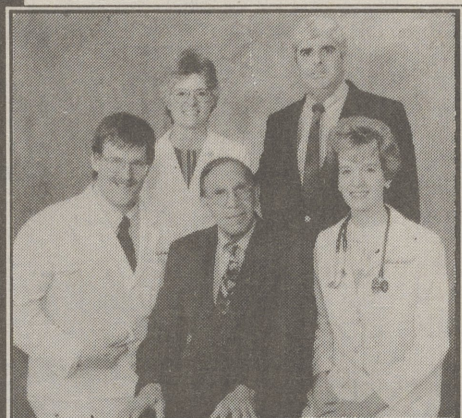
The program, in conjunction with the behind-the-wheel classes, will allow students to receive a rate reduction from their insurance companies.
