

Special farm loans available

The Consolidated Farm Service Agency (CFS) (formerly Farmers Home Administration) has a loan program designed to help members of social disadvantaged groups, including minorities, to acquire land for farming in Pennsylvania and/or to provide operating funds.

Under the program, CFS will try to find persons in those categories who are interested in farming and can qualify for either a direct or guaranteed farm ownership loan and/or operating loan.

CFS can also provide other loan and technical assistance, if needed, to help the borrower get

started. Socially disadvantaged population groups are Hispanics, Native Americans, Blacks, Asians and Pacific Islanders. The definition was recently expanded to include women.

Persons who think they might be eligible and who are in farming or who would like to become farmers are urged to contact the Rural Economic and Community Development (RECD) County Office, (formerly Farmers Home Administration) (FmHA), located at 911 West Main Street, Plymouth, PA. 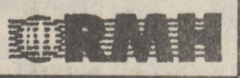
