Three Back Mountain students at Marywood College received their degrees in May and were inducted into the Marywood College Alumni Association by Michaele Ketchum Mastriani, national president.

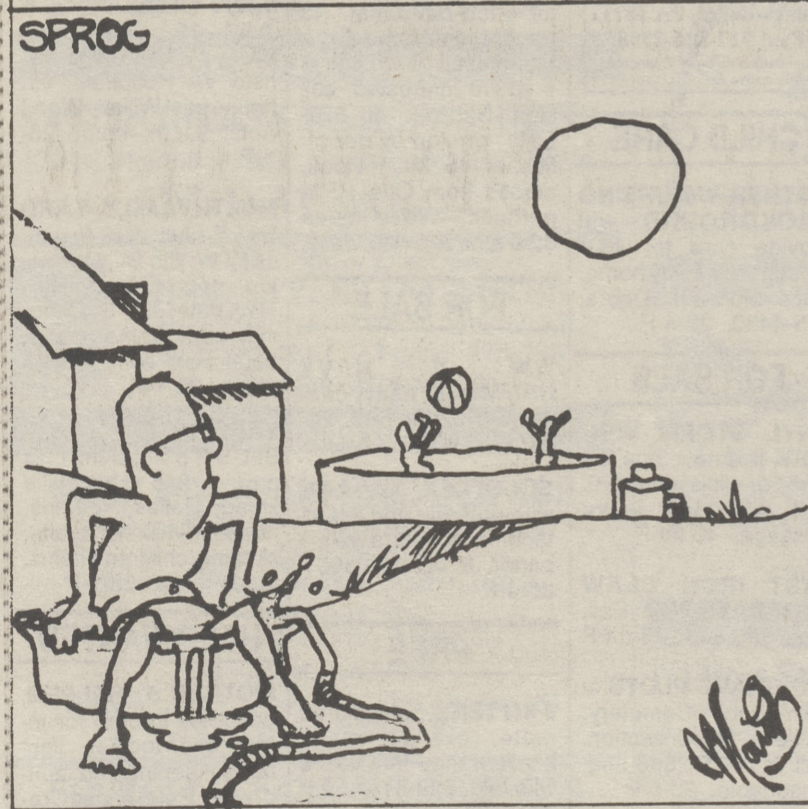
