Kyle and Devin Williams, sons of Brenda and Dale Williams, Shavertown, will celebrate birthdays in July.

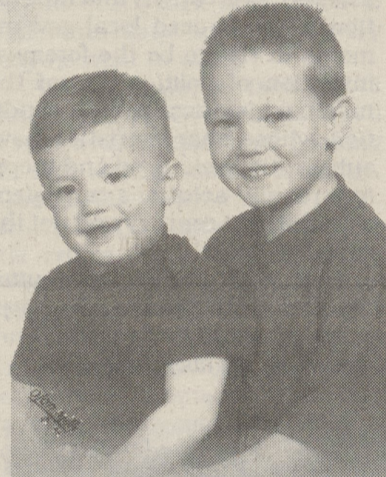
Kyle was five years old on July 4. He will start kindergarten in September.

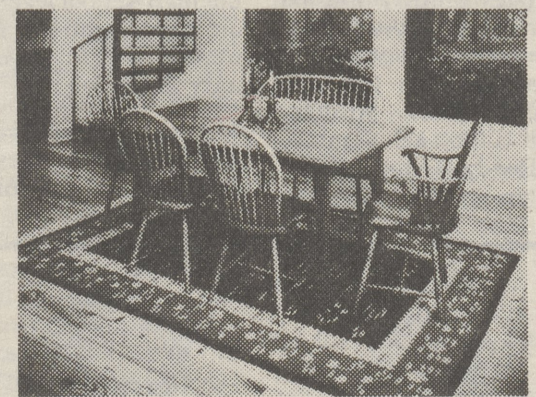

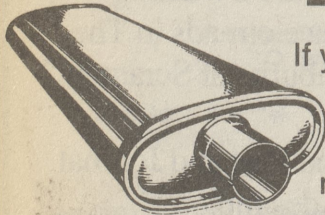
