#### Sox end perfect season with title

DALLAS TOWNSHIP - The Red Sox took the Back Mountain Major League softball championship with a convincing 6-1 win over the Dodgers Thursday night. The victory at W. W. Kubis Memorial Field enabled the Sox to close out the season undefeated.

April Naugle struck out eight Dodgers and allowed just one run on five hits during the complete game victory. Naugle walked three batters and also

The top three batters in the Sox line-up, Julia Chiampi, Rachel Kukosky and Amanda Stolarick combined for five hits, five runs and drew two walks.

After leaving two Dodgers stranded on base in the top of the first, the Sox wasted no time getting on the scoreboard. Kukosky hit a one out double to right center and scored the game's first run on a wild pitch.

Naugle helped herself by driving home Stolarick, who had walked, with a single to right.

The top, of the order accounted for two more runs in the third. Chiampi and Kukosky lead off the inning with singles before Stolarick worked Melonie Sappe for a walk. Chiampi scored on a wild pitch before Sarah Armand's ground out to short scored Stolarick.

The Dodgers avoided a shutout by scoring a run in the fourth. Sappe slashed a single to right center and advanced to second and third on wild pitches. She scored on Jesse Tarity's ground out to pitcher.

The Dodgers left the bases loaded during their final at bat. Christy Hiller lead off the sixth with a single and advanced to third on a single up the middle by Tarity. April Adelson drew a two-out walk to load the bases, but Naugle fanned Kristen Nelson to end the game.

District Attorney, Peter Paul Olszewski.


Down 4-0 after 2 1/2 innings of play, Horlacher crept back into the game with one run in the third and two more in the fourth before their fifth inning heroics.
