1778 Battle of Wyoming will be recreated July 15-16

The Twelfth Annual Revolutionary War Encampment and Reenactment of the Battle of Wyoming will be held on the grounds of the Swetland Homestead, 885 Wyoming Avenue, Wyoming, July 15 and 16. This event is jointly sponsored by the Wyoming Historical and Geological Society and the 24th Connecticut Militia, 1st Independent Company. The original Battle of Wyoming took place July 3, 1778.

The camp and the Swetland Homestead will be open from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. July 15, and from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. July 16. The reenactment takes place each day at 2 p.m. Tickets for the encampment and house tour are available for \$4.00 for adults and \$2.00 for children under 12. 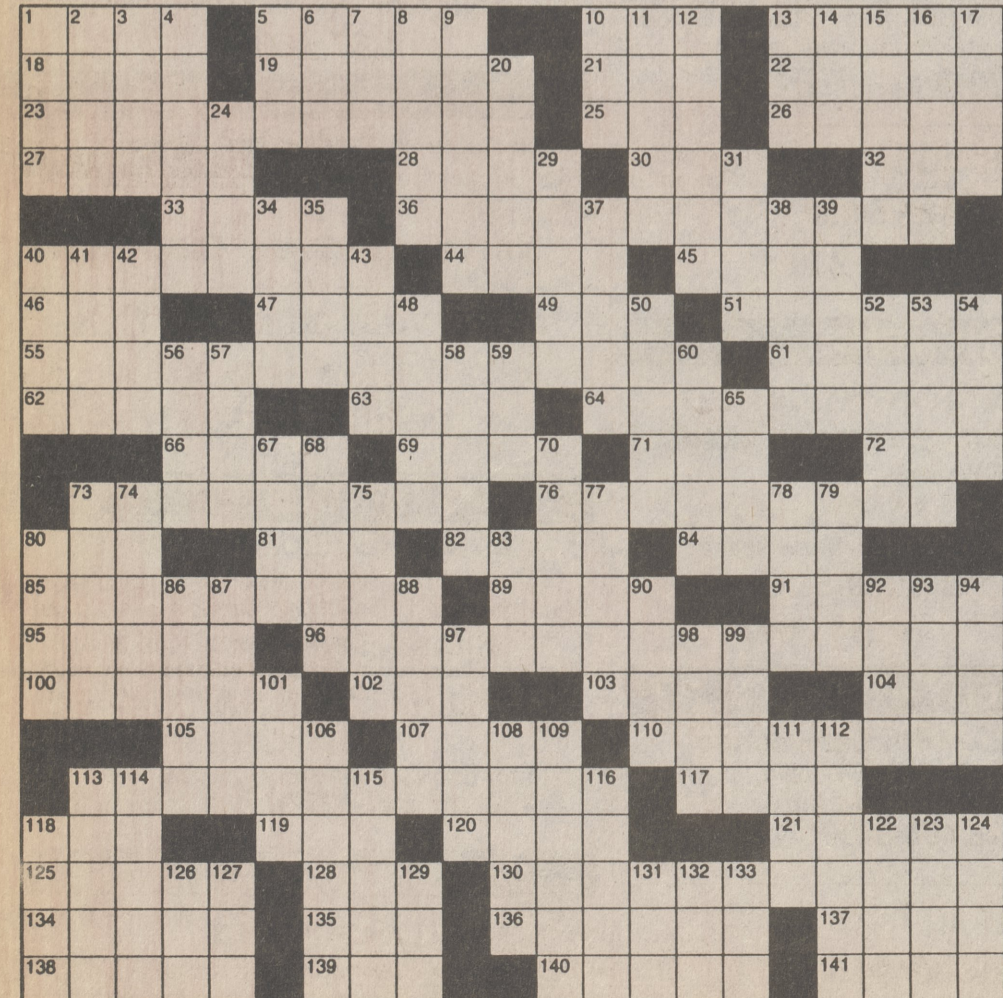
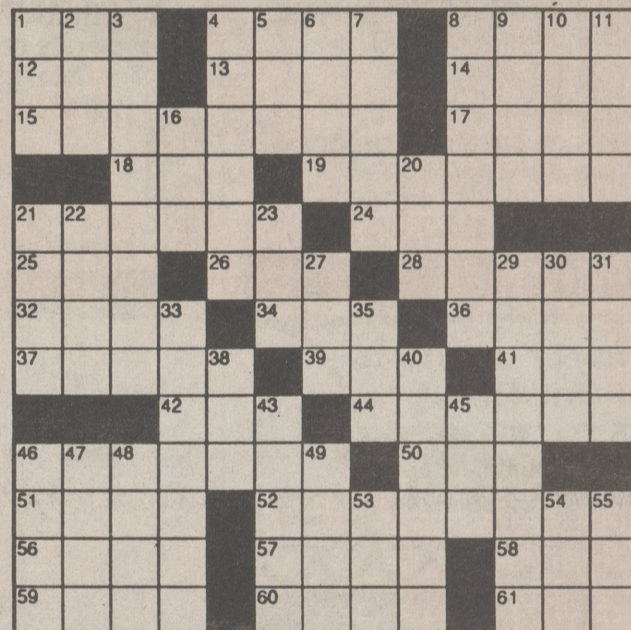
