#### Gauthier finishes Navy sea duty

Navy Petty Officer 2nd Class Wallace C. Gauthier, son of Wallace J. and Florence M. Gauthier of Dallas, recently returned to Norfolk, VA from a six-month overseas deployment to the Mediterranean Sea with the destroyer tender USS Shenandoah.

Gauthier was one of 1,528 sailors aboard the ship who completed the 11,000 mile voyage which began in late November.

Gauthier's ship served as a floating repair facility for forward deployed U.S. Navy surface ships and their electronic equipment rewind electric motors, and exotic metals. Gauthier's ship also is equipped with machine shops and even has a foundry for making parts.

While spending 48 days at sea, Gauthier also visited Crete, Cyprus, Israel, Italy, Sardinia, Sicily and Spain. During tour to Rome, Shenandoah crew members attended a Papal Audience at St. Peter's Basilica. Another highlight occured when about a dozen crew members were baptized in the Jordan River during a port visit to Haifa, Israel




