# Irem Temple will celebrate centennial Sept. 2

Irem Temple A.A.O.N.M.S. is celebrating the 100th anniversary of its charter this year.

The Mosque on North Franklin Street in Wilkes-Barre is the fraternal home of the nearly 5,000 Shrine Masons from 17 counties in Northeastern Pennsylvania.

This building is of Arabic architecture, with a domed roof and four minarets, and has been a landmark in Wilkes-Barre since its completion in 1908. It is the home for clowns, bands, marching, musical and motorized units which have entertained young and old alike at thousands of area parades. As has been said many times, "The Shrine is a parade in itself".

Irem also brings the annual Shrine Circus to the Kingston Armory every spring, inviting Scouts, church groups and hospital patients to attend free of charge, thanks to the generosity of the "Circus Daddies".

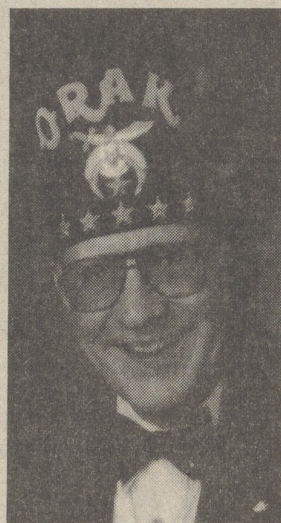
The main concern of Shriners

is helping crippled and burned children, by maintaining 19 orthopaedic and three burns hospitals where patients receive free care and treatment. These hospitals are supported wholly by Shriners, with no help from government or any outside agency. The Shrine of North America is building a new hospital in Philadelphia.

The cornerstone of the Mosque was removed in June and will be replaced at a ceremony at 10:30 a.m. September 2. Illustrative Sir Paul G. Nicholson, Potentate of Irem Temple, invites all Shriners, their families and guests to attend this ceremony.

The day will be highlighted by the "Ceremonial Ball" on the pavilion of the Irem Temple Country Club in Dallas. Social hour and dinner in the main building will start at 6 p.m., and dancing will start at 9 p.m.

Imperial Sir Robert B. Bailey, "the Number One Shriner in North America," will attend.

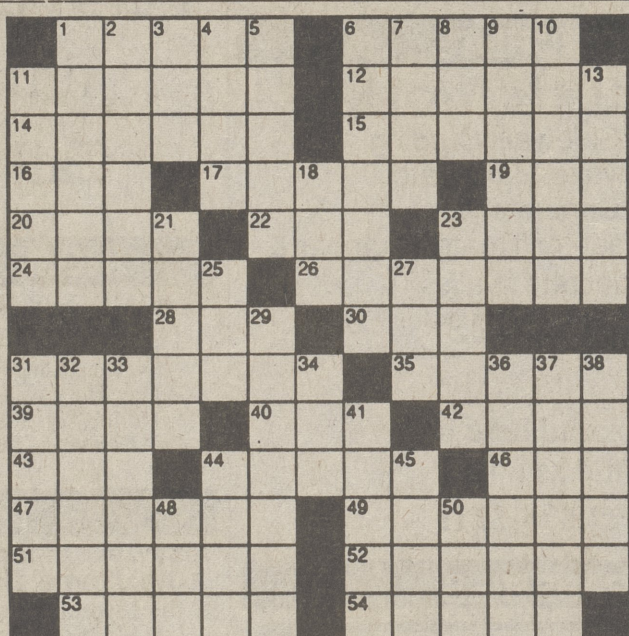
