Local dancers will appear in children's ballet

Wilkes University will host the children's ballet, "Melinda's Masquerade," at 7 p.m. on Saturday, September 16, and at 2 p.m. on Sunday, September 17, in the Dorothy Dickson Darte Center for the Performing Arts, South and River Streets.
