

Artists invited to design trout stamp

Local wildlife artists have a chance to "put their stamp" on the 1997 fishing season, according to Sen. Charles Lemmond (R-20).

The Pennsylvania Fish and Boat Commission is inviting artists to enter a contest that could result in their work being pictured on the 1997 Pennsylvania Trout/Salmon Stamp. The stamp is required of Pennsylvania trout and salmon anglers, who must purchase one annually and affix it to their licenses.

Artists are invited to submit a work that features any one of two dozen select Pennsylvania streams. The work that is judged best in the contest will then be reproduced and depicted on the 1997 Trout/Salmon Stamp and Print.

Lemmond encouraged local artists to submit an entry. "I know there are many talented artists in our area and I hope some of them take advantage of this opportunity to produce a work that captures the natural beauty of Pennsylvania," he said.

Contest guidelines and entry

forms are available by contacting: Timothy L. Klinger, Trout/Salmon Stamp Program Manager, Pennsylvania Fish and Boat Commission, P.O. Box 67000, Harrisburg, PA 17106-7000; phone (717) 657-4537.

Entries may be in oil, acrylic, or water color and must measure 12 inches by 18 with a one-inch border. The stream should be the primary focus, but angler(s) and/or trout may also be depicted in the scene. Deadline to enter is May 16, 1996.

In addition to having his work reproduced for the trout stamp, the winning artist will receive up-front payments of \$3,000, along with fees for signed stamps, prints and mini-prints. Second- and third-place winners will be awarded \$1,000 and \$500 respectively.

Previous stamps pictured different types of Pennsylvania trout. The '96 stamp will feature Harvey's Creek in Luzerne County and is expected to be the first in a series of popular Pennsylvania streams.


