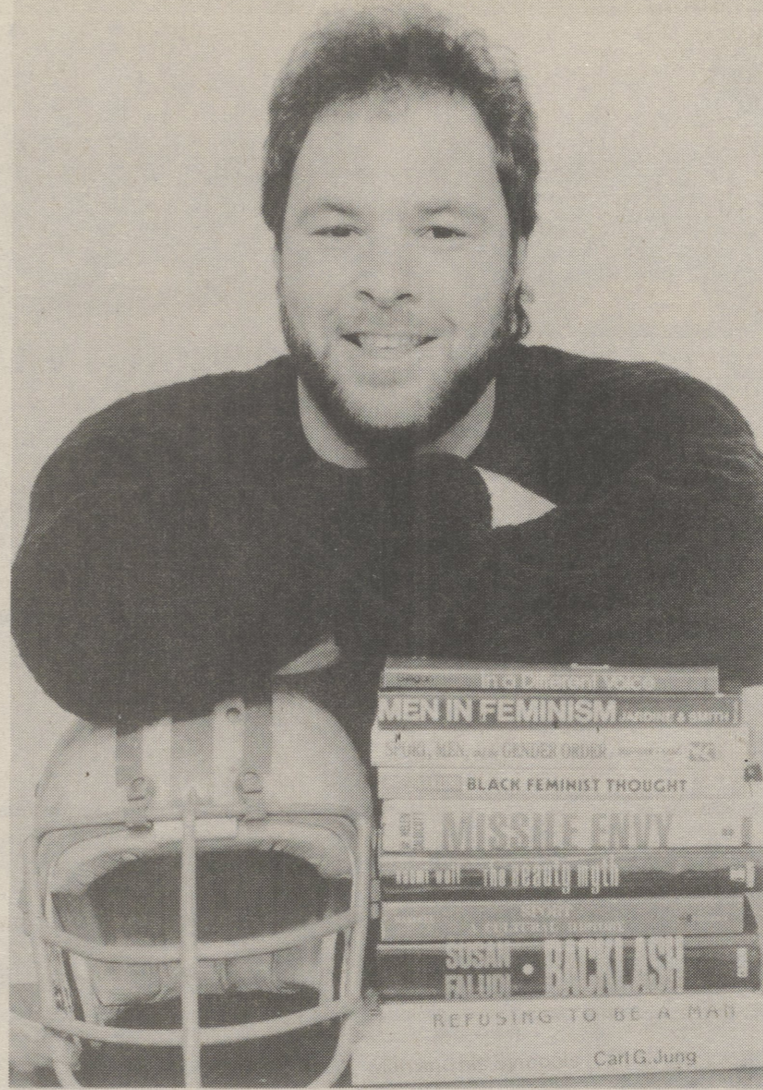

Stereotypes of women will be topic



Jackson Katz will speak on media stereotypes of women at College Misericordia October 19 at 8 p.m. His presentation is free and open to the public through the college's Diversity Institute, student activities office and athletics department.

Jackson Katz has a problem with the attitudes some Americans have about women. He believes the media not only perpetuate but intensify stereotypes of women and violent behavior toward women by men.

Through a combined sponsorship of the student activities office, the Diversity Institute and the athletics department, Katz will appear at College Misericordia October 19 at 8 p.m. in Walsh Auditorium. The audience will have an opportunity to ask Katz questions following the lecture.

The program is free and open to the public.

Katz spoke at Misericordia last March as part of the celebration of Women's History Month. After his presentation, which was attended mainly by women, college and student leaders decided to bring him back, this time to focus his message on male members of the community.

According to his previous lecture, Katz believes men learn, through the negative presentations of women in the media and in society in general, to despise anything considered feminine in themselves.

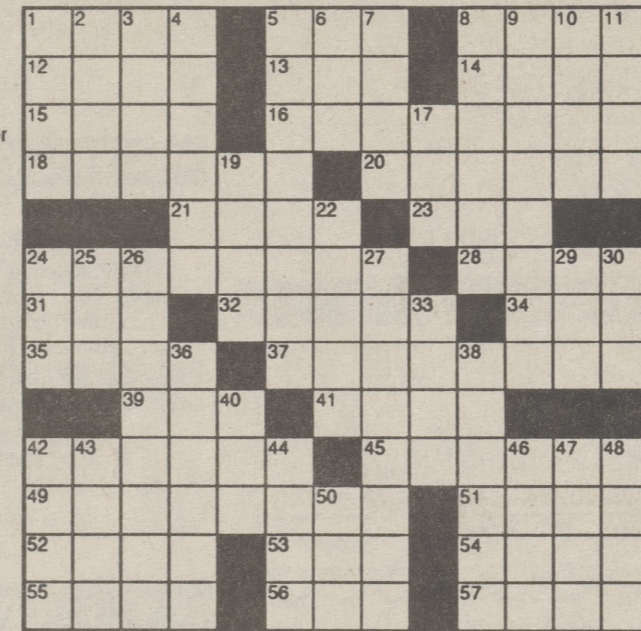

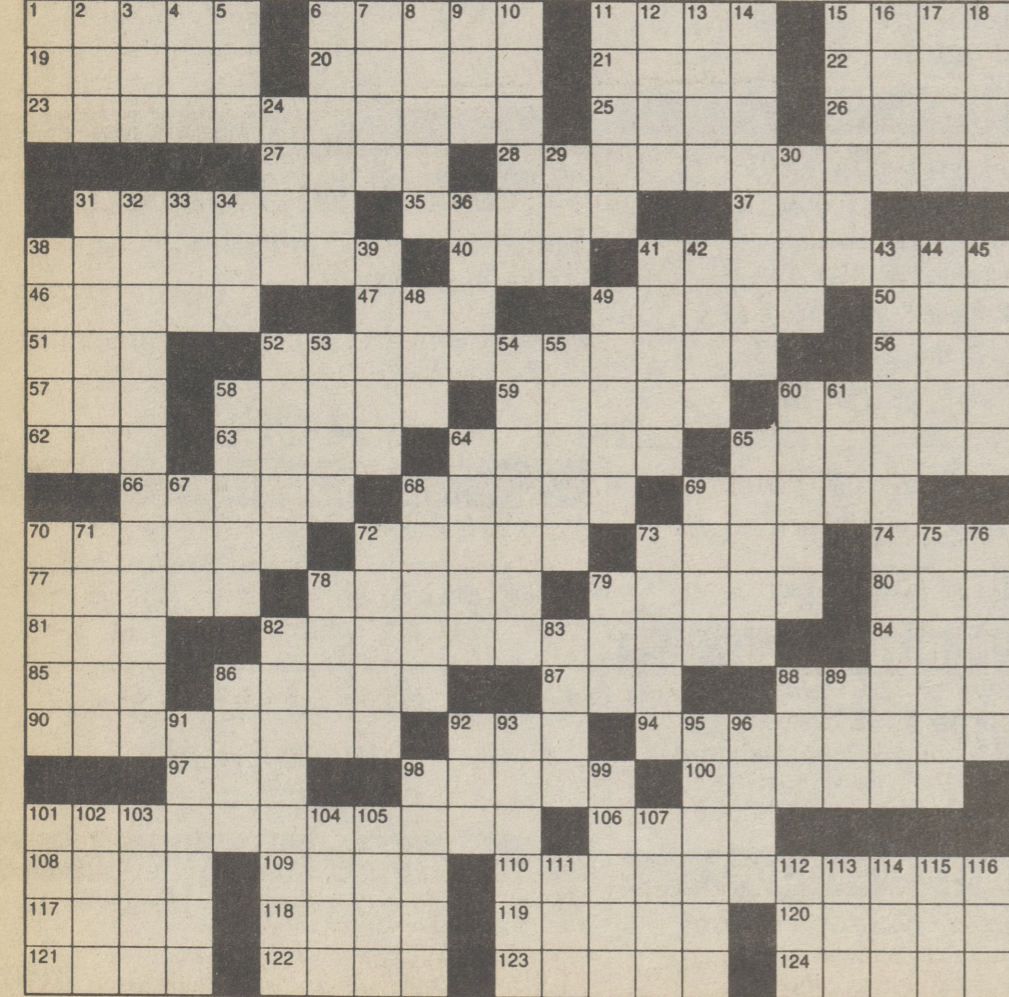
