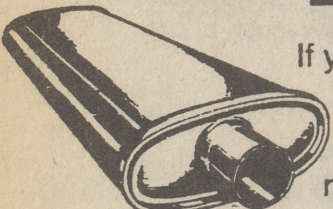

## Philharmonic to present special Halloween concert

Musical tricks and treats and a costume parade for children will be part of the family fun when the Northeastern Pennsylvania Philharmonic and music director Hugh Keelan celebrate Halloween on Friday, October 20, at the F.M. Kirby Center beginning at 8 p.m.

To concoct this Halloween Pops concert, Keelan had dipped into the classical repertoire, the movies and television for orchestral compositions that add up to a frightful good time.

The concert opens with *Baba Yaga* by Liadoff, a piece based on a legendary witch from Eastern European mythology.

A graveyard frolic, from midnight to first light, is the background of Saint-Saens' familiar *Danse Macabre*.

Spooky midnight antics continue with *A Night on Bald Mountain* by Modest Mussorgsky, depicting spirits and supernatural voices alive in the night. It wouldn't be Halloween with-

out witches and Keelan provides them for his Pops audience in *The Witches Ride* from *Hansel and Gretel* by Humperdinck.

The horror movie genre provides more recently material, including selections from *The Bride of Frankenstein*, *Helraiser* and the Hitchcock thriller *Vertigo*.

Concertgoers will recognize music from popular television programs, including the themes from *Twilight Zone* and the *Funerary March of a Marionette* by Gounod, better known as the theme music to the popular series of the early 1960s, *Alfred Hitchcock Presents*.

The *March* will provide the background music for the children's parade and parents are urged to bring their youngsters in costume.
