Dallas Borough fall leaf collection has begun. All residents are requested to rake their leaves into rows, no wider than three feet, along the front edge of their yards. Branches, stones and other yard waste materials will damage the vacuum leaf collector. Residents who wish to do so may continue to place leaves in bags, no larger than 33 gallons for collection. All bags should be placed along the curb for pick-up. Leaf collection days will be Tuesdays and Wednesdays.

All leaves collected by the borough are turned into shredded mulch and delivered to local farmers or residents to provide nutrients and improve the soil.


