Free eye exams for senior citizens

Senior citizens without the means to pay for eye care may qualify for free exams and treatment under a national program known as the National Eye Care Project and made available by the Pennsylvania Academy of Ophthalmology.

Pennsylvanians 65 and older who lack access to an ophthalmologist may call 1-800-222-EYES to see if they qualify as disadvantaged. Eligible seniors will be referred to a local volunteer ophthalmologist for a free exam. Diseases and eye conditions that are diagnosed will also be treated at no expense.

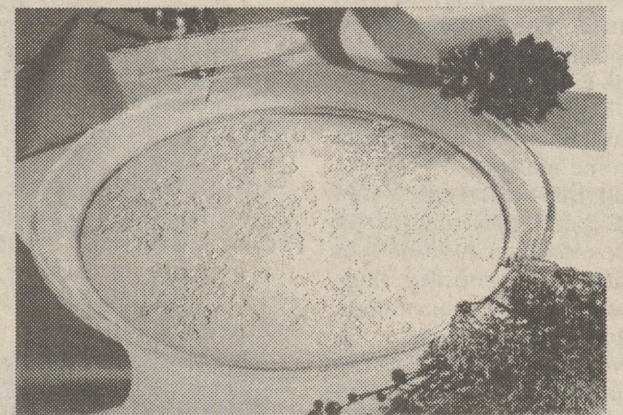
