extra work also develops a sense of commitment.

"These workouts separate the women from the girls and the men from the boys," Stretanski said.

The team had hoped to be part of the WVC this season, but that's one area where Dallas didn't make any headway. The school district waited to commit themselves because they wanted to see if the kids would do the same. Everything is a go to become part of the league next year.

"It would be nice to have a set practice every day after school, but you can't blame anyone for the situation," said Stretanski. "Thanks to the generosity of Valley West we can work on some diving this year."

The boys' team will heavily rely on seniors Dean Evans and Kyle Baker as well as sophomores Andy Popielarz and Tim Herbert.

Senior Marlena Saxon and junior Alisa Harris lead the girls team. Look for Emily Schweitzer (junior) and Stephanie Potisek (freshman) to make a real splash in the diving events.

The attitude and the work ethic may be there, but Dallas still comes up short in terms of swimming competitively. Many of the team members are just learning how to race and train in the pool. "Our inexperience is going to hurt us," Stretanski. "We'd like to win a few more meets, qualify a few more for districts and win some medals at districts."

Heather Dougherty replaces Marty Leandri as assistant coach. Dougherty is also a senior member of the Misericordia team and has qualified for NCAA competition.
