Kamin will bring comedy, mime to PSU



Dan Kamin, comedian and mime, will bring his unique blend of comedy and illusion to the Penn State Wilkes-Barre Campus December 4 at 7:30 p.m. in the Fortinsky Auditorium Center for Technology. The program, part of the campus' Fall Cultural and Performing Arts Series, is free and open to the public.

In his program, "Slick Moves," Kamin will present a multimedia blend of weird skills, rude stunts and outrageous comedy. It is a dazzling combination of eye-popping movement illusions and mind-boggling sleight-of-hand magic, capped by some of the routines Kamin created for recent movies.

He will also appear as the mysterious "Corpozoid Man," a ghostly figure who moves in hypnotic slow motion and looks like a corporate recruiter from the twilight zone.

Kamin began performing at the age of 12 as a birthday party magician. He attended Carnegie Mellon University to study industrial design, but instead discovered another kind of magic, the uncanny movement illusions practiced by theatre professor Jewel Walker. Kamin was hooked, and for several years he became the sorcerer's apprentice.

He has performed at the White House, Lincoln Center, and in Canada, Belgium and England.

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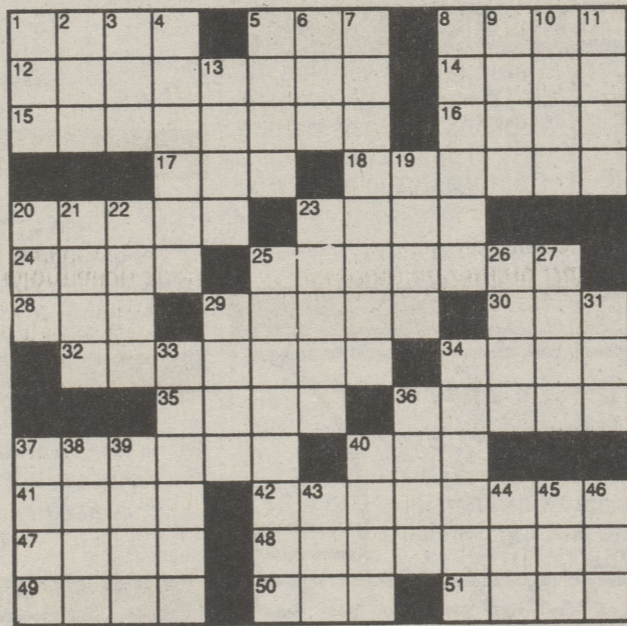
