DISTRICT COURT BRIEFS

MULTIPLE CHARGES FROM CAR CHASE

Eric John Slempa, 18, of Pittston waived his right to a preliminary hearing Dec. 7 before District Justice James Tupper on misdemeanor charges of fleeing police and reckless endangerment, and a traffic citation for running a stop sign.

A related traffic citation for reckless driving was dismissed, according to court records.

The charges stemmed from an incident Nov. 28, in which police observed Slempa turn his car onto Lower Demunds Road, spin its tires and spin sideways. When police attempted to pull him over, he drove away at a high rate of speed, running a stop sign at Fern Brook Corners and continuing up East Overbrook Ave., where he lost control of the car, coming to rest in the front yard of the Larry Dymond residence.

Arresting officer Charles Rauschkolb of Kingston Township was assisted in the chase by Sgt. Michael Moravec, officer James Ibbotson, Dallas Borough patrolman James Martin and Dallas Township patrolman Robert Jolley.

Represented by public defender Jonathan Blum, Slempa is free on \$5,000 bail.

D.U.I. CHARGES SENT TO COUNTY COURT

Two defendants waived their rights to preliminary hearings on charges of D.U.I. Dec. 7 before District Justice James Tupper and are free on \$300 bail.

Joseph DeMarco, 32, of Trucksville, was arrested Oct. 26 by

Kingston Township officer Walter Davis after he smashed his car in the front yard at 228 Carverton Road and failed field sobriety tests.

Police found a silver tin foil marijuana pipe, a pack of cigarette rolling papers and a plastic bag containing marijuana seeds.

Blood and urine tests showed his blood alcohol level to be .164 and contained traces of marijuana and prescription pain killers.

He was also charged with possession of drug paraphernalia.

DeMarco was represented by public defender Jonathan Blum.

Linda Newton, 34, of Dallas, was arrested Oct. 23 by Kingston Township officer Robert Parrish after police observed her driving erratically on Route 309.

Her blood alcohol level was .152. The state maximum limit is .10.

She was represented by attorney Jeffrey Cappellini.
