Suzanne Rossetti Memorial Art Contest seeks entries

All area students in grades 7-12 are invited to enter the 14th Annual Suzanne Maria Rossetti Memorial Juried Art Contest. The contest is sponsored by Joe and Sue Hand of Dallas in memory of the daughter of Louise and the late Peter Rossetti of Saugus, MA.

The contest is open to any 7th through 12th grade student who resides in, or attends any public, private, or parochial school within the school districts of Dallas, Lehman, Tunkhannock or Northwest, or any 7th-12th grade students who study art with any private instructor teaching within those areas.

All framed work and unframed stretched canvas must be ready to hang with screw eyes and wire, not saw tooth hangers or string. Each student may submit a total of three entries.

Ribbons will be awarded in 12 different categories on each separate grade level by two panels of three judges each. In addition, many community sponsored cash awards will be assigned by a separate awards jury.

The public is invited to the Opening Reception of the 15th Annual Suzanne Maria Rossetti Memorial Juried Art show on Sunday, March 3, 1996 from 1-4 p.m. at the MacDonald Art Gallery, College Misericordia, Dallas. 


