A certificate is awarded upon successful completion of the three required courses and five of the electives. Those who do not want to take the entire sequence are welcome to take any course or courses that interest them.

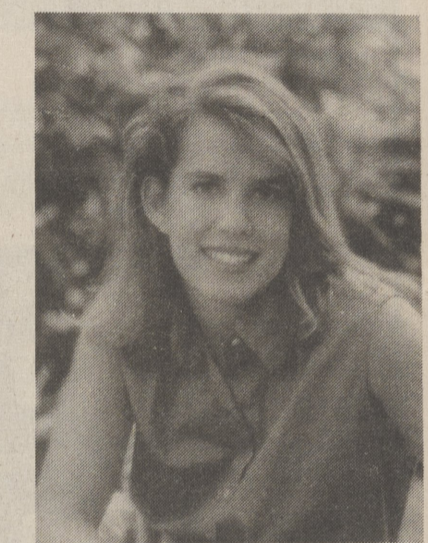

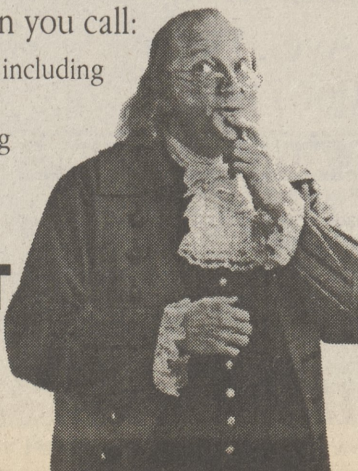

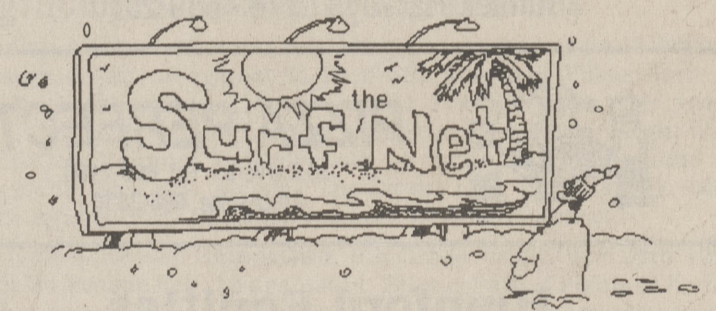
