Recently Dallas Middle School students attended an assembly on chemical reactions, given by Matthew Kriebel from the Franklin Institute of Philadelphia.

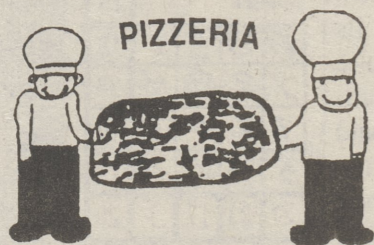
The assembly was funded from monies raised, by the students, during the annual magazine campaign.
