
Outstanding students

secondary education. Upward Bound students attend weekly academic classes and workshops on career and self-development. They also have an opportunity to attend summer residential program, take educational trips and


participate in leadership activities. Wilkes University has hosted the Upward Bound program since it was undertaken in 1967.
