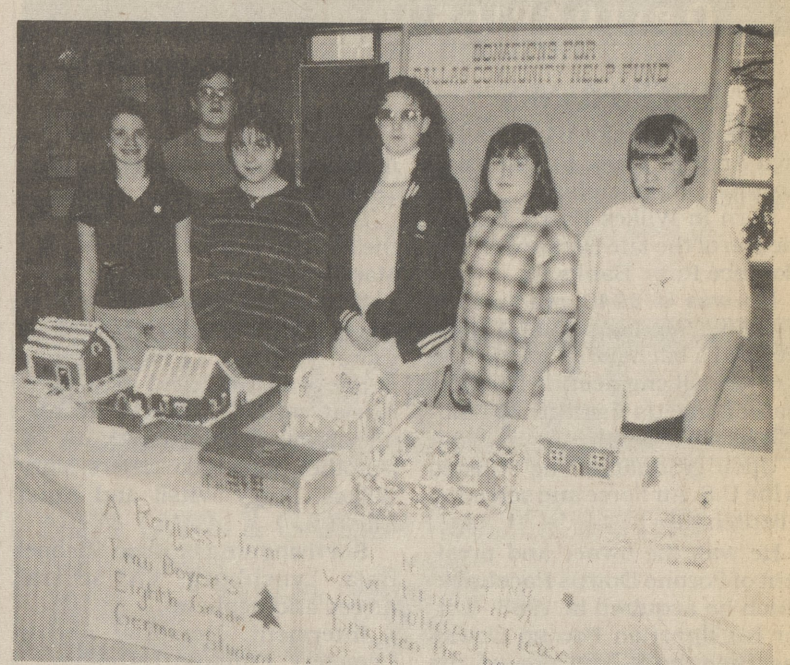
## Transition night for Lake-Lehman sixth graders
