Planting for Wildlife starts with Game Commission

A Planting for Wildlife Program will be offered by the Pennsylvania Game Commission to benefit all types of wildlife, by selling a specially selected packet of seedlings, a wildlife food plot seed packet and Bluebird nesting box kits, available through May 10 at the Northeast Regional Office on Route 415, Dallas, 8 a.m. to 3 p.m. The packet of seedlings will contain three each of the following species: white pine, American bittersweet, midwest crabapple,

callery pear and white spruce. Each packet sells for \$2. An information leaflet with instructions for planting and care of these seedlings will be included. The wildlife food plot seed packets will consist of a 10 pound mixture of assorted seeds, which will plant one third to one half acre. The mixture includes grain sorghum, proso millet, buckwheat, and sunflower. Each packet will sell for \$3. Bluebird nesting box kits will sell for \$4 each.
