

Junior Achievement will honor Dr. Wallace Stettler

Back Mountain resident Dr. Wallace F. Stettler will be inducted into the Junior Achievement Business Hall of Fame on May 1 at the Woodlands Inn and Resort, Route 315, Wilkes-Barre. The Business Hall of Fame recognizes significant contributions to the growth and development of business and community.

Stettler served as president of Wyoming Seminary College Preparatory School in Kingston for 23 years until he stepped down in June, 1990. He is now president emeritus of the school.

He was instrumental in raising more than \$15 million to update the school's educational program and renovate school facilities damaged from flooding in 1972.

Stettler, a native of Philadelphia, is a past member of the board of directors and the execu-

tive committee of the National Association of Schools, Colleges and Universities of the United Methodist Church and served on the University Senate. He founded the University Senate's Commission on College Preparatory Schools.

Dr. Stettler served as a 27 year member of the board of trustees of Lycoming College in Williamsport. He serves on the Wilkes University Council, the Leadership Wilkes-Barre steering committee and the board of directors of the Wilkes-Barre YMCA.

He is secretary of the board of directors of the F.M. Kirby Center for The Performing Arts, and vice president of the board of the Northeastern Pennsylvania Philharmonic.

Dr. Stettler and his wife, Sue, reside in Dallas.
