Butler, a senior designated hitter from Dallas was 6-10 (.600) at the plate in a 6-0 week for the Mountainers. Despite sitting out two games with a pulled hamstring, he still belted two home runs while driving in 10 RBI's. In addition he scored seven runs and had a slugging percentage of 1.200. For the season, Butler is hitting .342 with 38 hits, including six home runs along with nine doubles and a team best 39 RBI's. Butler ranks in the PSAC East in RBI's and third in home runs.




